(എ) ഡൽഹിയിലെ റിപ്പബ്ലിക് ദിന പരേഡിൽ അവതരിപ്പിക്കുന്നതിന് കേരളത്തിന്റെ ഫ്ലോട്ട് ഇല്ലാതായതിന്റെ കാരണം വെളിപ്പെടുത്താമോ ;

(എ) പ്രതിരോധ മന്ത്രാലയത്തിന്റെ കീഴിലുള്ള 15 അംഗങ്ങളുള്ള എക്സ്പെർട്ട് കമ്മിറ്റിയാണ് ഫ്ലോട്ടുകൾ തിരഞ്ഞെടുക്കുന്നത്. ആകെ യുള്ള 28 സംസ്ഥാനങ്ങളുടെ അപേക്ഷകളിൽ നിന്നും 13 സംസ്ഥാനങ്ങൾക്കാണ് സാധാരണ അനുമതി ലഭിക്കാറുള്ളത്. ക്വട്ടേഷൻ ക്ഷണിച്ചു ലഭിക്കുന്ന ഡിസൈനുകൾ ടി എക്സ്പെർട്ട് കമ്മിറ്റി മുന്പാകെ സമർപ്പിക്കുകയും ആയതിൽ നിന്നും ഫ്ലോട്ടിനുള്ള ഡിസൈൻ ടി കമ്മിറ്റി തിരഞ്ഞെടുക്കുകയുമാണ് ചെയ്യുന്നത്. എക്സ്പെർട്ട് കമ്മിറ്റിയുടെ ആദ്യ മീറ്റിംഗിൽ കേരളത്തിന്റെ പുലികുതി തിരഞ്ഞെടുക്കപ്പെടുകയും ടി കമ്മിറ്റിയുടെ 5-ാമത് മീറ്റിങ്ങിൽ നിരസിക്കപ്പെടുകയുമാണുണ്ടായത്

(ബി) കേരളത്തിന്റെ പുലികുതി തിരഞ്ഞെടുക്കപ്പെടുകയുണ്ടായോ ; എങ്കിൽ അവതരിപ്പിക്കാൻ കഴിയാത്തത് ആരുടെ വീഴ്ച മൂലമായിരുന്നു;

(ബി) ഇല്ല. കേരള സംസ്ഥാനത്തിന്റെ ഫ്ലോട്ട് എക്സ്പെർട്ട് കമ്മിറ്റി നിരസിച്ചതിനാൽ ഫ്ലോട്ട് അവതരിപ്പിക്കാൻ കഴിഞ്ഞില്ല. ഇക്കാര്യത്തിൽ ആരുടേയും വീഴ്ച ഉണ്ടായിട്ടില്ല.

(സി) റിപ്പബ്ലിക് ദിന പരേഡിൽ ഫ്ലോട്ട് അവതരിപ്പിച്ചതിന് ഏതെല്ലാം കാലയളവിൽ കേരളത്തിന് സ്വർണ്ണമെഡൽ ലഭിക്കുകയുണ്ടായി ;

(സി) 1996, 2007, 2008 വർഷങ്ങളിൽ കേരളത്തിന് സ്വർണ്ണമെഡൽ ലഭിച്ചിരുന്നു..

(ഡി) 2006 മുതൽ തുടർച്ചയായി കേരളം ഫ്ലോട്ട് അവതരിപ്പിച്ചിട്ടുണ്ടായിരുന്നോ: ഈ വർഷം മുടങ്ങാനിടയായ സാഹചര്യം എന്തായിരുന്നു ?

(ഡി) 2006 ൽ കേരളത്തിന്റെ ഫ്ലോട്ടിന് അനുമതി ലഭിക്കുകയുണ്ടായില്ല. 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 വർഷങ്ങളിൽ കേരളം ഫ്ലോട്ട് അവതരിപ്പിക്കുകയുണ്ടായി. പ്രതിരോധ മന്ത്രാലയത്തിന്റെ എക്സ്പെർട്ട് കമ്മിറ്റി കേരളത്തിന്റെ ഫ്ലോട്ട് നിരസിച്ചതിനാൽ കേരളത്തിന് ഈ വർഷം ഫ്ലോട്ട് അവതരിപ്പിക്കാൻ അനുമതി ലഭിച്ചില്ല.

**PUBLIC (SERVICES — B) DEPARTMENT**

G.O. (Ms.) 4/61/PC.

Dated, Trivandrum, 2nd January, 1961.

Abstract:- Public Services — Mutual and inter-departmental transfers — Principles — Revised orders issued.

Read:— 1. G.O. (Ms.) No. 455/Public (Services), dated 16th April 1959.

2. Letter No. A6-11069/59, dated 22nd August 1960 from the Secretary, Kerala Public Service Commission.

**ORDER**

In supersession of the orders in the G.O. cited, the Government direct, in consultation with the Kerala Public Service Commission, that mutual or inter-departmental transfers of Government servants from one unit to another within the same Department, or from one Department to another within the same Subordinate Service may be ordered by the Appointing Authorities concerned on request, subject to the following conditions:—

(1) A person transferred to a new unit will take rank below the juniormost in the category in the new Unit or Department. He will not be allowed to count his previous service towards seniority. Such transfers should not be prejudicial to the legitimate interest of anyone in the department to which he is transferred. But he may be allowed to count his previous service towards increment, leave, pension, gratuity, etc. He will not be required to undergo fresh probation, if he has already completed probation:

(2) A permanent person need not be required to relinquish his permanency. He may be permitted to retain his permanent lien in the old post until he is confirmed in the new unit or department; but he can come back to the old unit or department only if and when there is no vacancy for him to continue in the new unit, or if for any reason his pay in the substantive post in the parent Department becomes higher than the pay of the new post held by him.

(3) Transfers should be made only in cases in which the posts concerned carry the same scale of pay and have the same qualifications and method of recruitment prescribed.

(4) Persons transferred from one department to another or from one unit to another in the same department due to proved administrative reasons will retain all their rights in the old unit or department, as the case may be.

(5) In the case of transfers [other than those coming under (4) above], no T.A. or joining time pay will be allowed whether at the time of first transfer or at the time of reversion to the parent Department.

2. If any exception from the above procedure has to be made in any case, the concerned Head of the Department may forward to Government detailed proposals showing the special reasons for making such exception. Government will then, in consultation with the Public Service Commission, where necessary issue appropriate orders in such cases.

✓ **Abstract:-** Public Services — Transfer to native districts and inter-departmental transfer — Concession to relatives/dependents of serving soldiers and relatives, dependents of defence personnel killed in action — Orders issued.

**ORDER**

In the G.O. read as second paper above, it was ordered that requests for transfers of near relatives of soldiers to their native places should be considered sympathetically. In the G.O. third cited the term 'near relatives' has been defined. In the G.O. fourth cited it was ordered that requests for inter-district transfer of Government servants who are near relatives of the army personnel as defined in the G.O. third cited would be sanctioned in deserving cases and that the conditions in G.O. (Ms.) No. 4/PD. dated 2-1-1961 regarding seniority will not be insisted on in the case of the transferees so that they may be allowed to retain their original seniority in the new district. In the G.O. read as fifth paper above sanctioning the scheme of Decentralisation of recruitment of the lower ministerial cadres at the district level, it has been ordered among other things that candidates recruited district-wise will not be allowed transfer from one district to another within a period of five years from the date of commencement of continuous service.

Government have examined the question of relaxation of the five year rule stipulated in the G.O. read as fifth paper in the case of dependents/relatives of serving soldiers and extension of the concession to the dependents/relatives of soldiers killed in action or died while on duty in the field/forward areas, in consultation with the Public Service Commission. As agreed to by the Public Service Commission, Government are pleased to order in relaxation of the five year rule referred to in para 3 (i) and 3 (ii) of G.O. (Ms.) No.154/71/PD. dated 27-5-1971 that requests for inter-district transfer of Government servants who are dependents relatives of serving soldiers/soldiers killed in action or died while on duty in the field/forward areas, would be sanctioned in deserving cases and that the conditions in G.O. (Ms.)No.4/PD., dated 2-1-1961 regarding seniority will not be insisted on in the case of the transferees so that they may be allowed to retain their original seniority in the new District.

Sub:— Public Services — Recruitment on district-wise basis — Restriction of inter-district transfers and inter-departmental transfer within the same district — Clarification — Issued.

According to the orders issued in the G.Os. cited recruitment to the following categories of posts is now being made district-wise: —

1. Leave Reserve Primary Teachers.
2. Leave Reserve Graduate Teachers.
3. Specialist teachers of various categories.
4. Senior Language Teachers in all languages.
5. Part-time Teachers in all languages.
6. General Nurse trainees and Auxillary Nurse Midwife trainees.
7. Copyists.
8. Clerks other than Assistants in the Secretariat, Public Service Commission's Office and Clerks in Advocate General's Office.
9. Stenographers.
10. Typists other than Typists in the Secretariat, Public Service Commission's Office and Advocate General's Office.
11. Typist-Copyists.
12. Clerk-Typists.
13. Amins.
14. Commerce Instructors in Shorthand and Typewriting.
15. Lower Division Compilers/Investigators/Punch Card Operators of Bureau of Economics and Statistics.
16. Nursery School Teachers.
17. Balawady Teachers in the Community Development Department.

One of the conditions prescribed for the district-wise recruitment of candidates to the above categories of posts is that the candidates so recruited district-wise should not be allowed transfer from one district to another within a period of five years from the date of commencement of continuous service. In the Circular 6th cited, instructions have been issued to all Heads of Departments and other Appointing Authorities to see that the five year rule prescribed in the G.O. 1st cited for inter-district/inter-departmental transfer of district-wise recruits is strictly adhered to in future.

2. A question has been raised as to whether the above restriction on inter-district transfer applies to mutual transfers as well. Government wish to clarify that the five year rule prescribed in the G.O. first cited will apply in all cases of inter-district/inter-departmental transfer including mutual transfer. Further if mutual transfers are allowed in relaxation of the 'five-year rule' referred to in paragraph 1 above, only such of them as could manage to arrange a mutual transfer with someone in another District will be benefited whereas the seniors who desire to have an inter-district transfer will have to wait for five years. Thus a person who could manage to get a mutual transfer will derive an undue advantage of seniority among transferees in the new District to which he goes over. This will give room for discontentment among the seniors who are not in a position to arrange to get mutual transfers.

3. Another question raised is whether the five year rule would apply in the case of inter-departmental transfers of district-wise recruits within the same district. Government also wish to clarify that the five year rule prescribed in the G.O. first cited would apply to inter-departmental transfers of district-wise recruits within the same district also.

**PERSONNEL & ADMINISTRATIVE REFORMS (ADVICE — C)

**Abstract:-** Public Services — Appointment of candidates by the Kerala Public Service Commission in the same category of posts in different districts — Counting of probation — Instructions modified — Orders issued.

**ORDER**

According to the condition (1) specified in the G.O first read above, mutual or inter-departmental transferees of Government servants from one unit to another within the same department or from one department to another within the same Subordinate Service ordered by the Appointing Authorities concerned on request will not be required to undergo fresh probation if they have already completed probation.

2. In the G.O. second read above, Government ordered that an inter-departmental transferee will have to undergo probation in the new department in accordance with the Special Rules. Consequently the rule position obtaining after the issuance of the G.O. dated 12-11-1976 is that an inter-departmental/inter-district transferee cannot reckon the period of probation put in by him in the old unit/department, in the new unit/department of appointment.

3. Government have ordered in the G.O. third read above, that a person who is not in service has the liberty to apply for any posts in any districts and that in such cases there is no harm in relieving a person who has got appointment in one district to accept appointment in another district for which he had applied for before his joining duty in the former district. He will also be allowed to count his previous service towards increment, leave, pension, gratuity etc. Further he will not be required to undergo fresh probation if he had already completed probation as in the case of inter-departmental/inter-district transfers as ordered in the G.O. first read above.

4. It has come to the notice that while issuing the G.O. dated 28-10-1986 the existence of rule position in the G.O. dated 12-11-1976 was not taken into account. Government therefore in consultation with the Public Service Commission Order that the last sentence in para (2) of the G.O. dated 28-10-1986 which reads as "further he will not be required to undergo fresh probation if he has already completed probation as in the case of inter-departmental/inter-district transfers as ordered in condition (1) of G.O. (Ms.) 4/61/PD. dated 2-1-1961" will be deleted.

5. The G.O. third read above stands modified to this extent.
