**ORDER**

As per orders read as first and second papers above No Objection Certificate and Letter of Permission respectively were issued to Sree Krishna College of Pharmacy and Research Centre, Parassala, Thiruvananthapuram for conducting Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm. D) course with an annual intake of 30 students. The institution had clinical tie up for conducting the course with Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Medical College and Hospital, Karakonam, Thiruvananthapuram.

2. As per letters read as third paper above institution requested Government to grant permission to utilize the facilities of Government District Hospital, Neyyattinkara for providing Pharmacy Practice programme to their Pharm D students. They also informed that they are willing pay fee for this purpose at rates fixed by the Government. The Director of Health Services vide paper read as fourth paper above informed that they do not have objection in granting permission to Sree Krishna College of Pharmacy and Research Centre, Parassala, Thiruvananthapuram for sending their Pharm D students to Government District Hospital, Neyyattinkara for Pharmacy Practice programme since the hospital have total bed strength of 300, blood bank, medical store and specialty units. It was also informed that the pharmacy unit of the hospital is presently functioning in the first floor of the OP Block, with four pharmacists and would be soon shifted to a new building with an area of 1200 square feet. However the institution can not utilize the service of pharmacists of the unit since they have assigned work. Besides, the institution will have to set up patient counseling centre and library essential for the conduct of Pharmacy Practice programme for which expenses will have to be fully borne by the institution themselves. But, they could use land adjacent to pharmacy building for this purpose.

3. The Director of Medical Education based on applications submitted by the institution and letter dated 23/07/12 of the Director of Health Services, vide paper read as fifth above, remarked that prior to the commencement of training, institution will have to obtain permission

from Pharmacy Council of India to change the hospital. The pharmacists in Government District Hospital, Neyyattinkara can not be used for student training since they already have certain assigned work. If the said course is to be run, as per report of the Director of Health Services, a department of Hospital and Clinical Pharmacy, patient counseling centre and library are to be established by the applicant institution. Government may take a decision whether such a private college is to be permitted to have a department set-up in a Government hospital and allow outside staff employed by a self financing college to work independently in Government hospital and hence does not recommend such an arrangement as it will lead to gross dilution of the standards of education.

4. Government examined application and reports of Director Health Services and Director of Medical Education in detail and considering the fact that students in private self financing institutions are rendered training in Government hospitals for courses like B.Sc./Post Basic B.Sc./M.Sc. Nursing, Government are pleased to grant permission to Sree Krishna College of Pharmacy and Research Centre, Parassala, Thiruvananthapuram to use Government District Hospital, Neyyattinkara for conducting Pharmacy Practice programme to the students of Pharm D course started in the institution from academic year 2010-11 subject to the approval of the Pharmacy Council of India, conditions in the Memorandum of Understanding and following additional conditions:

- i. Services of staff including Pharmacists attached to the Pharmacy unit of the hospital shall not be provided to the students attending the programme. Teaching and non-teaching staff required for conducting the programme shall be arranged by the institution themselves.
- ii. Institution shall set up patient counseling centre and library essential for the conduct of Pharmacy Practice programme in the land adjacent to pharmacy building by meeting expenses from their own funds and on condition that the ownership of the centre and library and its properties shall vest with Government after it is created.
- iii. Institution shall send students and staff to the hospital only in accordance with a training schedule prepared by the Superintendent of the hospital in consultation with institution.
- iv. A non-refundable training fee of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) per student per academic year shall be remitted by the institution to HMC/HDC/HDS. Besides, the institution shall remit one time non-refundable admission fee of Rs. 100/- per student under the Head of Account 0210-03-105.
- v. Students and the staff accompanying the students shall strictly obey the rules and regulations of the institution. All of them shall be under control of the Superintendent or official deputed by the Superintendent while they are in the hospital.
- vi. Superintendent or an official of the hospital deputed by the Superintendent shall maintain one nominal register and the same must be produced for verification on demand.

vii. Institution shall be liable to make good for the loss students commits damage or loss of hospital equipments and properties.

5. The Superintendent of the hospital shall execute Memorandum of Understanding with the Management of the institution as given in the Annexure to this order.

6. The training facility provided in the hospital shall be withdrawn if the institution violates any of the conditions in the Memorandum of Understanding and those listed above and if they fail to execute agreement with Government in respect of admission and fee for admissions to Pharm D course from academic year 2013-14 onwards.


The parties hitherto agree as follows:

1. Party one declares that \_\_\_\_\_ (name of the hospital) is a \_\_\_\_\_ (number) bedded hospital, with a minimum of 120 beds for General Medicine Department.
2. Party one agrees to provide to party two the minimum space necessary of 1200 square feet in the hospital building to establish Pharmacy Practice department for the conduct of Pharm. D programs.
3. Party one agrees to provide preceptors required to train the Pharm. D students.
4. Party one agrees that, it will not enter into similar agreement with any other Pharmacy institution/s or department/s offering or intend to offer Pharm. D programs.
5. The prospective students will be allowed to undergo training in the following specialty departments
  - Medicine
  - Surgery
  - Pediatrics
  - Gynecology and Obstetrics
  - Psychiatry
  - Skin and VD
  - Orthopedics
6. Party two will provide the academic staff and necessary infrastructure for Pharm. D course as per the PCI norms and takes the overall responsibility for smooth conduct of the programs.
7. This agreement is to be in effect at least for ten years from the time of its endorsement by both the parties.
8. The officials representing \_\_\_\_\_ hospital and \_\_\_\_\_ college are signing this MOU to achieve the beneficial objectives of Pharm. D programs.
