



CHIEF JUSTICES AND RETIRED JUDGES - SANCTIONED - ORDERS ISSUED.

ORDER

The Registrar General of the Hon'ble High Court vide his letter read above has requested to issue necessary Government orders sanctioning the services of home orderly, driver, security guard and secretarial assistance to former Chief Justices and Judges of the High Court or an amount of Rs.15,000/- per month to former Chief Justices and Rs.12,000/- per month to former Judges for defraying the services of such personnel and also requested for sanctioning a residential telephone, free of cost, with number of free calls to the extent of 1,500 calls over and above the free calls allowed by telephone authorities, to the former Chief Justices and Judges.

2. In the High Level Meeting of the Honourable Chief Minister with the Honourable Chief Justice on 19.01.2013, this request was also considered and was decided to sanction Rs.10,000/- per month to retired Chief Justices of the High Court of Kerala and Rs.8,000/- per month to the retired Judges of the High Court of Kerala, provided they are not having any Government assignment.

3. In the above circumstances Government are pleased to sanction an amount of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) per month to retired Chief Justices of the High Court of Kerala and an amount of Rs.8,000/- (Rupees Eight thousand only) per month to the retired Judges of the High Court of Kerala provided they are not assigned with any Government assignment.

ORDER

In compliance of the judgment in WP(C).No. 1022/89 of the Honourable Supreme Court, and based on the recommendations of the Shetty Commission, the State Government have issued orders vide reference read as first paper above revising pay scales of Judicial Officers in the State with effect from 01.01.1996 with monetary benefit with effect from 01.07.1996. It was interlay provided in the aforesaid Government Order that

( i ) the arrears due to revision of pay scales for the period from 01.07.1996 to 31.08.2001 shall be credited to the General Provident Fund, ( ii ) DA will be allowed as per the State Rules and ( iii ) same as provide above, all the allowances like HRA & CCA, rates of pension shall be on the rates applicable to State Government employees.

2. In addition to the benefits already sanctioned the following items were also granted as per the Government Order read as 2<sup>nd</sup> paper above.

- 1) Dearness Allowance (DA) at Central rates by merging 50% of the DA with basic pay.
- 2) City Compensatory Allowance (CCA) as applicable to Central Government employees.
- 3) Transfer Grant as stipulated in Government of India Rules regarding transfer.

3 The following items of Perks has also been sanctioned vide G.O. read as 3rd paper above.

1. Medical allowance at the rate of Rs. 100/- per month
2. Rent free accommodation  
Levying of 4% from the Basic Pay of the Officers will be dispensed with.
3. Telephone facility to all the Courts and the eligible Judicial Officers as recommended by the Commission
4. Electricity and water allowance (50% of actual expenses subject to a maximum of Rs. 350/- per month)
5. Sumptuary allowance at the rate of Rs. 1,000/-, 750/-, 500/- to District Judges, Sub Judges, Magistrates respectively
6. Robe Allowance - Rs. 5,000/- once in 5 years
7. Newspaper Allowance (Two dailies and one magazine)
8. LTC and HTC

4. In the order read as 4th paper above Supreme Court has pointed out certain short comings in the orders issued and directed the Chief Secretaries to rectify them.

5. Government have examined the matter in detail and pleased to issue orders as contained in the subsequent paragraphs.

6. The following benefits are sanctioned with retrospective effect from 1.11.1999.
  - (i) Medical allowance @ Rs.100 per month for all judicial officers.
  - (ii) 50% of the electricity and water charges for the residence. The maximum ceiling of Rs 350 p.m. imposed vide G O dated 30.1.2006 may be lifted.
  - (iii) Sumptuary allowance @ Rs 1000, Rs. 750, Rs. 500 per month to District Judges, Sub Judge and Magistrates respectively.
  - (iv) Robe Allowance @ Rs 5000. once in 5 years. The 5-year period will start from 1.11.1999

Newspaper allowance (2 Dailies and 1 magazine) against certificate to be furnished.

Conveyance allowance

7. Conveyance allowance by way cost of 50 liter of Petrol/Diesel to the Judicial Officers who own 4 wheelers and 25 liter of Petrol/Diesel to the Judicial Officer who own 2 wheelers is sanctioned to those Judicial Officer posted in District Center.

Dearness Allowance

8. The Dearness Allowance at Central rates has already been sanctioned w.e.f. 1-7-2004. Merger of DA (at 50% of basic pay) with basic pay, ordered in Government of India Central Government employees w.e.f. 1-4-2004, has been sanctioned to the judicial officers w.e.f. 1-6-2005 only. This is sanctioned w.e.f. 1-4-2004 as Government of India.

Special Pay

Decision on payment of special pay will be taken urgently on the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh's proposal of evolving the principle in the matter (as directed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India), received only on 28/8/06 vide reference cited sixth above.

Domestic help allowance to retired judicial officers

Domestic help allowance of Rs.1250 p.m. is sanctioned to the retired Judicial Officers w.e.f. 1-11-1999 on production of a certificate to this effect.

Medical allowance to retired judicial officers

Medical allowance of Rs 100 p.m. is sanctioned to the retired Judicial Officers w.e.f. 1-11-1999 on condition that only the difference between medical allowance payable and what has actually been paid will be reimbursement.

Medical Facilities

All the Medical facilities that are being given to serving judicial officers with regard to medical expenditure and reimbursement of expenditure, are made applicable to retired judicial officers.

Revision of Pension

The following revision of pension is sanctioned w.e.f. 1-1-1996.

1.1.1996 pensioners

- (i) 10 years service shall be the minimum qualifying service for pension.
- (ii) 50% of the last pay drawn pay shall be the pension. There will be no ceiling on the maximum pension.
- (iii) Commutation of the pension to the extent of 50% will be allowed. Restoration of commuted pension will be done only after 15 years. This will apply to all those who get the benefit of 50% commutation.

(b) Pre 1.1.1996 Pensioners

- (i) Pension of the retired judicial officers shall be 50% of the minimum pay of the post held at the time of retirement and as revised from time to time.
- (ii) There shall not be any ceiling limit on the maximum pension payable.

This order is issued in modification of G.O.s read as 2nd & 3rd paper above relating to DA, Perks and Pension.
