(എ) സംസ്ഥാനത്തെ സ്വകാര്യ സ്വാശ്രയ എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജുകളിൽ ഈ വർഷത്തെ വിദ്യാർത്ഥി പ്രവേശനം സംബന്ധിച്ച് മാനേജ്മെന്റുകളുമായി സർക്കാർ ധാരണയിലെത്തിയിട്ടുണ്ടോ; വിശദാംശം നൽകുമോ;

(എ) സംസ്ഥാനത്തെ സ്വകാര്യ സ്വാശ്രയ എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജുകളിൽ ഈ വർഷത്തെ വിദ്യാർത്ഥി പ്രവേശനം സംബന്ധിച്ച് കേരള സെൽഫ് ഫിനാൻസിംഗ് എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജ് മാനേജ്മെന്റ് അസോസിയേഷൻ, ആർക്കിടെക്ചർ കോളേജ് മാനേജ്മെന്റ് അസോസിയേഷൻ എന്നിവരുമായി കരാറിലേർപ്പെട്ടിട്ടുണ്ട്. കേരള കാത്തലിക് എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജ് മാനേജ്മെന്റ് അസോസിയേഷനുമായി 2017 ൽ മൂന്ന് അധ്യയന വർഷത്തേയ്ക്ക് (2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20) കരാർ ഒപ്പുവച്ചിട്ടുണ്ട്. കരാർ അംഗീകരിച്ചു കൊണ്ടും, കരാറിലെ പ്രധാന വ്യവസ്ഥകൾ ഉൾപ്പെടുത്തിക്കൊണ്ടും പുറപ്പെടുവിച്ച സർക്കാർ ഉത്തരവുകളുടെ പകർപ്പ് അനുബന്ധം I, II, III ആയി ചേർത്തിട്ടുണ്ട്.

(ബി) ഈ വർഷം എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജ് പ്രവേശനത്തിനുള്ള പ്രവേശന പരീക്ഷയുടെ മിനിമം മാർക്ക് ലഭിക്കാതെ 35 ശതമാനം കുട്ടികൾ അയോഗ്യരായ സാഹചര്യത്തിൽ എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജുകളിൽ നിലവിലുള്ള സീറ്റുകളിൽ വിദ്യാർത്ഥികളെ ലഭിക്കാത്ത സാഹചര്യമുണ്ടോ;

(ബി) 2018-19 അധ്യയന വർഷം പ്രവേശന പരീക്ഷാകമ്മീഷണർക്ക് അലോട്ട്മെന്റുമായി ലഭിച്ച 36213 സീറ്റുകളിൽ 16234 വിദ്യാർത്ഥികൾ മാത്രമാണ് ഓപ്ഷൻ നൽകി പ്രവേശനം നേടിയിട്ടുള്ളത്. കൂടാതെ, എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗിൽ നിലവിൽ യോഗ്യരായ വിദ്യാർത്ഥികളുടെ എണ്ണവും കഴിഞ്ഞ വർഷം അനുവദിച്ച സീറ്റുകളുടെ എണ്ണവും താരതമ്യം ചെയ്യുമ്പോൾ എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജുകളിൽ നിലവിലുള്ള സീറ്റുകളിൽ വിദ്യാർത്ഥികളെ ലഭിക്കാത്ത സാഹചര്യം ഉണ്ടാവാൻ സാധ്യത കുറവാണ്.

(സി) അഞ്ചുവർഷമായി 30 ശതമാനത്തിൽ താഴെ മാത്രം പ്രവേശനം നടത്തുന്ന എഞ്ചിനീയറിംഗ് കോളേജുകൾ അടച്ചുപൂട്ടണമെന്ന് അഖിലേന്ത്യാ സാങ്കേതിക കാൺസിൽ നിർദ്ദേശിച്ചിട്ടുണ്ടോ; ഇതിന്റെ

Abstract

Higher Education - Technical - Admission to Professional Degree Courses for the academic year 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20, Fee structure and Allotment of seats by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in the Self Financing Engineering Colleges under Kerala Catholic Engineering College Managements Association (KCECMA) - Orders Issued.

  - 2) Agreement executed on 7<sup>th</sup> day of June 2017 by Government of Kerala and Kerala Catholic Engineering College Managements Association (KCECMA).

ORDER

The Prospectus for Admission to Professional Degree Courses, Kerala 2016 has been approved by the Government vide Government Order read as first paper above.

As per the clause 1.7 of the Prospectus "Allotment of seats from the Rank lists for all courses in Self-financing Colleges will be made in accordance with the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India /High Court of Kerala or orders of the Government of Kerala/Government of India as per the law in existence at the time of Centralised Allotment Process (CAP) and will be notified separately."

Government vide 2<sup>nd</sup> paper above entered into agreement with Kerala Catholic Engineering College Managements Association (KCECMA) representing 14 (fourteen) Private Engineering College Managements for seat sharing, tuition fee payable, collection of interest-free deposits and other charges for the academic years 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20 in respective colleges.

In the circumstances, Government are pleased to approve the agreement and publish the major clauses of the Agreement with regard to the fee structure and allotment of seats for information, appropriate action and compliance by all concerned.

1) 50% of the total seats in each of the Member Colleges are set apart to be filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE) from the List prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on the basis of merit in accordance with the and Reservation principles followed by Government from time to time. The remaining 50% seats will be filled up by the Managements of the Member colleges. Of this 50%, 35% of the total seats will be filled up by the Managements and remaining 15% of the total seats filled up by the managements from the dependants of the Non Resident Indian Category.

2) The Educational agency shall fill up 50% of the total seats from among students who satisfy the prescribed criteria of academic eligibility for admissions. The educational agency shall admit and fill up 35% seats from the applications received by the educational agency as detailed in Paragraph 18.

3) Nothing in this agreement shall be deemed as a surrender of the unconditional rights of the Association or the member colleges regarding admission of students in all the seats in the colleges.

4) The Managements are entitled to fill up 15% seats in NRI category (NRI) by admitting qualified students who are dependents of Non Resident Indians. All these Students are exempted from qualifying in any Entrance Test and can be admitted based on their academic eligibility as stipulated by the respective University.

5) The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the list of the students to be admitted in the college by the Management and the Management shall admit the students specified in the list. The students in the list will be given specific instructions as to the date and time of presentation before the college for admission, the amount of fees to be paid, the amount of refundable deposit to be remitted, and the records to be submitted at the time of admission. The Management need admit only those students who have complied with the instructions as required by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations.

6) The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall be free to make any number of allotments. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will assign only such students for admission to a college who are finally allotted to that college. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall complete all allotments as decided by him before the 20th day of July 2017. The last date for such students to join the respective colleges will be 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 2017. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will not re-allot students already allotted to a college and admitted in the college either by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations or the Management after this final allotment.

7) The Educational Agency shall be entitled to fill up those seats still remaining unfilled after the 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 2017, from the seats set apart for allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. These unfilled seats from Government side will be reverted to the Educational Agency as additional management seats and the Educational Agency can fill up those seats as per Paragraph 18.

The fee payable by all the students shall be Rs.75,000/- (Rupees Seventy five thousands only) per annum and over and above the fees, all the candidates, other than those students allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations who belong to SC, ST, OEC or Fishermen community, will have to make a one-time interest free deposit of Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees One lakh Only) which will be remitted by Banks concerned in case of educational loan or by the students as the case may be. The interest free refundable deposit shall be part of the fee structure. The students allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall remit Rs.10000/- (Rupees ten thousands only) of the first year tuition fee at the specified bank, and such amount shall be returned by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. For the students admitted in the member colleges based on the allotment of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, the rest of the Tuition Fee, Special fee, any Statutory fee and any other Miscellaneous fee shall be paid by the student directly in the college at the time of admission in the college based on the allotment of the student but not later than July 25, 2017. The amount retained by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in respect of each student shall be paid to the college before September 15, 2017.

9) The fees payable by NRI candidate will be the same as that of the other candidates. In addition to this, they will have to pay to the College up to but not more than US\$ 7000 at the time of admission as fixed by each Member College. However, they do not have to remit the interest free refundable deposit of Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees one lakh only)

10) Where a student has at the time of admission remitted fees as envisaged in this Agreement, but thereafter is found eligible for the total fee exemption after the Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme or found eligible for the Scholarship specified below, the Management is liable to return the excess fee realized from the student within one week of the intimation of such concession by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, and the Management shall be liable to pay interest to the Student at 18% per annum for any delay over this stipulated period of one week. Furthermore, where the student has been admitted to a college after the first allotment but has subsequently been allotted to another College on the basis of the second allotment/final allotment, the Management is liable to return the entire fee remitted, by the student, if any, by way of Demand Draft after proper acknowledgment within three days of the second allotment/final allotment to the Student, failing which the Management shall be liable to pay interest to the student at 18% per annum for any delay over this stipulated period.

11) In the case of SC/ST/OEC candidates and students from fishermen community, the fees shall be paid by Government. However, they will not be required to deposit the one time Interest Free refundable deposit of Rs.1,00,000/- (One lakh only) In lieu of this deposit, Government shall pay an amount of Rs.8000/- (Rupees Eight Thousands only) per annum in addition to the fees specified above. Separate orders will be issued by the Department of Scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes Development on the procedures to be followed in this regard. The students from the fishermen community who are admitted to the member colleges based on the allotment of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations are eligible for educational concessions given to the students from the Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes families. The Department of Fisheries shall issue separate orders in this regard.

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12) In case any candidates make the deposit, out of any bank loan, the respective colleges will stand guarantee for the return of the deposit to the Bank and in such case the Colleges will refund the deposits only to the banks concerned. The candidates will have to give the interest portion of such deposits directly to the Banks concerned.

13) The Educational Agency shall be entitled to collect from every student admitted to the College irrespective of whether they have been allotted by Commissioner for Entrance Examinations under reservation or otherwise or by the Management, Caution Deposit of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) and other *pro rata* expenses which the colleges has to pay to the University, from students joining in Member Colleges. Such fees and amounts shall be specifically listed out in the prospectus and published each year by the Member college. The Management will be entitled to collect from each student up to but not more than Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) per annum towards the value added courses and special facilities, if any, provided by the Management. The Association and the Educational Agency hereby undertake not to collect any amount from any student so admitted, other than those specified above.

14) The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall allot 10% of the total seats (i.e. 6 in every batch of 60) from among the students belonging to the community to which the educational Agency belongs on the basis of merit. However, for the colleges belonging to Latin Catholic Community, the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall allot 15% of the total seats (i.e. 9 in each batch of 60) from among the students belonging to the community, on the basis of merit. For allotment under these categories, every member College shall inform the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2017 regarding the community, criteria for eligibility and documents to be submitted for the same. This right is at the option of the Educational Agency. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations should obtain such documents from students before 25<sup>th</sup> day of June 2017, so that allotment based on the merit to such seats can be done in the online counseling process along with other seats. If sufficient number of candidates are not available under this category the balance seats will be reverted as State Merit (SM) Seats for allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations during the online counseling.

15) The Educational Agency can retain the tuition Fee remitted by the student, in the event a student admitted under the Management quota or Government quota, deserts or discontinues his/ her studies for any reason at any time after 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 2017. The Educational Agency shall also be entitled to collect the tuition fee of the entire course. However, in the event of the seat so falling vacant being filled up by a new candidate, the tuition fee collected as per this clause shall be refunded. The documents pertaining to such student shall be released only on payment of the above amount. Provided that candidates will not have to make any payment, as stated above, if such candidate is forced to leave the college on the grounds of ragging, or serious illness as certified by a medical board which prevents the student from continuing with his or her studies in the college. In the case of students joining AFMC/NDA/Naval Academy/ Defense Institutions, also will not have to make such payment but subject to the final outcome of the W.P(c) No. 645/2014 pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala.

16) Each Member College shall be bound to report to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, the seats remaining unfilled after the admission following the second allotment. The third and final allotment by Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall be done taking into account the reported position also. If any Member College fails in so furnishing the exact details of unfilled seats, then all the seats, for which the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations has allotted students for any course of a Member College, shall be deemed to have been filled. Seats that are not reported to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on the date specified after the admissions are to be closed following the second allotment/Final allotment shall not be available for filling up as additional seats for admissions as stipulated above. Furthermore, default in reporting such unfilled seats shall be deemed to be a violation of this Agreement, and the Government shall have the right including retaining the share of the tuition fee remitted by the Student with the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, recommending to the University for cancellation of affiliation of the course for which such admissions have been made in breach of this Agreement and for withholding permission for the renewal of validity of the course for the succeeding years.

17) The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has sanctioned 5% of the total intake as supernumerary seats for admission under Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme, and such seats have to be mandatorily allotted. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall fill up these seats under the Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme as per AICTE norms. "the total number of students admitted both in the Government Quota and Management quota will be available on the last date of admission and copy of list forwarded to the APJ Abdul Kalam Technological University shall be forwarded to the Commissioner as well for effecting allotment under Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFW)".

18) The Educational Agency shall fill up 50% of the total seats from among students who satisfy the prescribed criteria of academic eligibility for admissions. The Educational Agency shall admit and fill up 35% seats from the applications received by the Educational agency on the basis of merit list prepared based on the marks obtained in the qualifying examination in the core subjects (mathematics, physics and chemistry) and marks secured in the entrance examination conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The educational agency will have the right to apportion the seats within this 35%, to various categories within the community or denominations thereof, based on *inter se* merits.

19) This Agreement is valid for the Academic Year 2017-18, 2018-19, & 2019-20, and shall not prejudicially affect the rights of the parties by virtue of the clauses herein, in respect of the cases pending before any Court of Law.

20) The Association and the Managements hereby undertake that no consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any student admitted by the Management to the college.

21) Every management will set apart a sum of Rs.3,00,000/- (Rupees three Lakhs Only), for a batch of 60 students to be provided as Scholarship in the form of Tuition fee waiver to students from Below Poverty Line (BPL) families, other financially poor and marginalized. Where the amount of Rupees Three lakhs is not adequate to

provide scholarships to students from BPL families, The Management shall make sufficient provisions for the same. The said money will be kept in a separate fund by the Management. However, if by any chance, the number of candidates admitted in any batch is less than 60, the above said sum will also be proportionately reduced.

22) The scholarship amount can be apportioned among the BPL and the other eligible candidates, in accordance with G.O. (MS) 689/2013/H.Edn dated 16/11/2013. The beneficiaries of this scheme will be confined to those allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The Candidates who are entitled to receive any other scholarship will not be entitled to the benefit of this scholarship or fee waiver.

23) If there is excess money remaining after covering the students from BPL families and those falling in the category 'economically poor' as defined by Government, the rest of the amount will be pooled in a scholarship fund for assisting students from 'BPL' and 'economically poor' families in the subsequent years.

24) Management reserves the right to seek an enquiry by any competent Agency of the income claimed by any student for availing the scholarship to avoid malpractices. In case it is found that, any candidate has availed the scholarship by furnishing false information, the amount so claimed could be forfeited from such candidates.

25) Calling for options and allotments to all Engineering Colleges, Whether Government/Aided/Unaided, shall be done simultaneously.

26) APPROVAL OF SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE:- Both parties to this Agreement shall place the Agreement before the fee Regulatory Committee and file the same for the approval and ratification of the Admission Supervisory Committee.

27) No consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received; accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any student admitted by the Educational agency to the college. It shall be the liability of the Association and the Educational agency jointly and severally to redress complaints from the students, parents or interested parties on any matter other than those covered by the terms and conditions of this agreement. Where the second party fails to redress any complaints referred to as above or on any matter covered under this agreement. Where the second party fails to redress any complaints referred to as above or on any matter covered under this agreement; it shall be the duty of the first party to take such steps as required to redress the complaint.

28) The dates mentioned in the paragraphs above apply only to the academic year 2017-18. In respect of corresponding dates for the academic years 2018-19 and 2019-20, the dates shall be determined by Government observing the same schedule, but mutais, mutandis, adjusting for eventualities like public holidays or national events. However, if the SECOND PARTY, finds that such adjustment has adversely affected their rights or interests they make a reference to Government and such differences shall be resolved amicably to the satisfaction of both parties.

29) All private self financing engineering colleges who are now part of Kerala Catholic Engineering College Managements' Association, which entered into this agreement need not be required to enter into separate agreement for the academic year 2017-18 ,2018-19, 2019-20, in respect of existing courses.



30) In case any of the Managements violates the provisions of the Agreement or collects any fee in excess of what is provided under the agreement, the admission supervisory committee shall initiate proceedings against such managements for imposing penalty, recommending for the withdrawal of affiliation by the University concerned etc.



Higher Education – Technical – Admission to Professional Degree Courses for the academic year 2018-19 - Fee structure and Allotment of seats by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in the Self Financing Engineering Colleges under Kerala Self Financing Engineering College Management Association (KSFECA) - Orders issued.

**ORDER**

The Prospectus for Admission to Professional Degree Courses, Kerala 2018 has been approved by the Government vide Government Order read as first paper above.

2. As per the clause 1.7 of the Prospectus "Allotment of seats from the Rank lists for all courses in Self-financing Colleges will be made in accordance with the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India /High Court of Kerala or orders of the Government of Kerala/Government of India as per the law in existence at the time of Centralised Allotment Process (CAP) and will be notified separately."

3. Government vide 2<sup>nd</sup> paper above entered into an agreement with Kerala Self Financing Engineering College Management Association (KSFECA) representing 97 (Ninety Seven) Private Engineering College Managements for seat sharing, tuition fee payable, collection of interest-free deposits and other charges for the academic year 2018-19 in the respective colleges.

4. In the circumstances, Government are pleased to approve the agreement and publish the major clauses of the Agreement with regard to the fee structure and allotment of seats for information, appropriate action and compliance by all concerned.

1. 50% seats in the member colleges will be filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations from the Rank list prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in accordance with Merit and Reservation principles followed by Government from time to time. The remaining 50% seats will be filled up by the Managements of the Member Colleges. Of this, 35% of the total seats will be filled up by the Managements from the eligible students who have figured in the rank list of the

recognized entrance list of KEAM-2018/JEE -2018/KEE - 2018 and the remaining 15% from the category of Non Resident Indians (NRIs).

2. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall issue notifications/ invite options and allotments on the Centralized Allotment process (CAP) and these shall be done simultaneously for all the Engineering Colleges, whether Government/ Aided / Un-aided/ Government Self - Financing / Private Self Financing both under Catholic Engineering College Management Association and under Kerala Self Financing Engineering College Management Association, etc.

3. The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has sanctioned 5% of the sanctioned total intake as supernumerary seats for admission under Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFW), and such seats have to be mandatorily allotted. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall fill up these seats under the Tuition Fee Waiver scheme as per AICTE norms, and to such Courses in an Institution where a minimum of 30% of approved intake in the respective Courses are filled up. The total number of students admitted both in the Government Quota and Management Quota will be available on the last date of admission and a copy of the list forwarded to APJ Abdul Kalam Technological University shall be forwarded to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations as well for effecting allotment under Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFW).

4. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations has to start Centralized Allotment Process (CAP) by inviting options from the students. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations has to publish the list of Colleges, their branches, number of seats included in the Centralized Allotment Process, their Fees, any special Fees for any course etc, for the information of the general public, students, parents, member colleges etc.

5. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall complete all allotments as decided by him before the 25th day of July 2018. The last day for such students to join the respective Colleges will be 25th day of July 2018. The joining of the allotted candidate in the Member Colleges shall be done from the Second phase of allotment. The induction training for students admitted to the Colleges shall begin on 16th July 2018.

6. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the lists of the students to be admitted in the College by the Educational Agency and the Educational Agency shall admit the students specified in the lists. The students in the lists will be given specific instruction as to the date and time of presenting themselves before the College for admission, the amount of fees to be paid, the amount of refundable deposit to be remitted, and the records to be submitted at the time of admission. The Educational Agency shall admit the students who have complied with the instructions as required by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the allotment lists of the students to be admitted to the Member Colleges on or before the 26th day of July 2018. Allotment details must

be published in the portal of the respective College after each allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will not allot students already admitted in the Member Colleges after the final allotment to any Engineering Courses.

7. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall not allot any student to the Educational Agency after the 25th July 2018 in any Engineering Courses. The Educational Agency shall be entitled to fill seats remaining unfilled in Member Colleges after the 26th July 2018 and these seats that remain unfilled in the Government Quota will be available to the Educational Agency as additional seats and the educational Agency shall fill-up those seats from among the applicants who have figured in the rank list of any of the recognized Entrance Tests conducted for the purpose.

8. The students allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall remit Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) of the first year Tuition Fee at the Specified bank and such amount shall be retained by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. For the students admitted in the Member Colleges based on the allotment of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, rest of the tuition fee, special fee, any statutory fee and any other miscellaneous fee shall be paid by the student directly in the College at the time of admission in the College. The amount retained by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in respect of each student shall be paid to the Colleges before 30th day of September 2018.

9. Where a student has at the time of admission remitted fees as specified in the Table below, but thereafter is found eligible for fee exemption under the Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme or found eligible for the Lower Fees specified in the Table below, the Management is liable to return the excess fee realized from the student within one week of the intimation of such concession by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, and the Management shall be liable to pay interest to the Student at 18% per Annum for any delay over this stipulated period of one week. Furthermore, where the Student has been admitted to a College after the second allotment but has subsequently been allotted to another College on the basis of further Allotment, the Management is liable to return the entire fee remitted by the student, if any, by way of Cash or Demand Draft after proper acknowledgement, within three days of the Third Allotment, failing which the Management shall be liable to pay interest to the Student at 18% per annum for any delay over this stipulated period.

10. Each Member College shall be bound to report to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, the seats remaining unfilled after the admissions subsequent to the each allotment. If any Member College fails in so furnishing the exact details of unfilled seats, then all the seats, for which the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations has allotted students for any course of a Member College, shall be deemed to have been filled. Seats that are not reported to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on the date specified after the admissions are to be closed

following the final allotment shall not be available for filling up as additional seats for admission as stipulated in the previous paragraph. Furthermore, default in reporting such unfilled seats shall be deemed to be a violation of this agreement, and the Government shall have the right including retaining the share of the tuition fee remitted by the student with the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, recommending to the University for cancellation of affiliation of the course for which such admissions have been made in breach of this Agreement and for withholding permission for the renewal of validity of the course for the succeeding years.

11. The fee structure applicable to the seats under the categories mentioned below in the Member Colleges, shall be as given below and this annual fees shall be the same for all the four years of study for the student admitted in 2018-19.

12. In the case of SC/ST/OEC / Communities eligible for educational concessions as is given to OEC / Candidates eligible for fee concession as per GO(Ms) No. 25/2005/SCSTDD dt 20-6-2005 belonging to Govt. Quota, all the fees shall be paid by the Government.

13. In case any student remit the interest free refundable deposit, out of any Bank Loan, the respective College will stand guarantee for the return of the Deposit to the Bank and in such cases, the College will refund the deposits only to the Banks. The students will have to give the interest portion of such deposits directly to the banks concerned.

14. The Educational Agency shall be entitled to collect from every student admitted to the College irrespective of whether they have been allotted by Commissioner for Entrance Examinations under reservation or otherwise or by the Management, Caution Deposit of Rs. 10,000 (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) and other prorated expenses which the College has to pay to the respective University, from the Students joining in Member Colleges. Such fees and amounts shall be specifically listed out in the prospectus and published each year by the Member College. The Management will be entitled to collect from each student up to but not more than Rs, 10,000 (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) per Annum towards the Value Added Courses and special facilities, if any, provided by the Management. The Association and Educational Agency hereby undertake not to collect any amount from any student so admitted, other than those specified above.

15. Out of the 50% category of seats filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall allot 15% of the total seats from among the students belonging to the Community / Registered Society / Registered Trust to which the Educational Agency belongs on the basis of merit. For allotment under these categories, every Member Colleges shall inform the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, regarding the Community, criteria for



eligibility and documents to be submitted for the same. This right is at the option of the Educational Agency. Those students who are seeking admission under the Community / Registered Trust Quota shall apply to the respective College and the College shall submit the list of such candidates to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on or before the dates notified by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, so that allotment on the basis of merit to such seats can be done in the online counselling process along with the other seats. If the respective College doesn't register their claims to this 15% or the list of such candidates, the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations is free to ignore this 15% claim and seats are reverted back to the state merit. Further, if sufficient numbers of candidates are not available under this category, the balance seats will be available as state merit seats for allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations during the online counselling.

16. The Educational Agency shall be entitled to fill up those seats still remaining unfilled after the closure of allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations for the seats set apart for allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. These unfilled seats from Government side shall be available to the Educational Agency as additional seats for admission and the Educational Agency can fill-up those seats from the candidates who have figured in the rank list of any recognized Entrance Tests conducted for the purpose.

17. The Educational Agency is entitled to fill up 15% seats in the NRI category (NRI) by admitting qualified students who are dependents of Non Resident Indians as per the section 2(o) of Act XIX of 2006. All these Students are exempted from qualifying in any Entrance Test and can be admitted if they satisfy the prescribed conditions of academic eligibility.

18. In the event of a student withdrawing before the starting of the Course, the entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than ₹1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) shall be refunded by the Educational Agency.

In case, if a student leaves after joining the Course and if the vacated seat is consequently filled by another student by the last date of admission, the Educational Agency must refund the fee collected after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than ₹1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) and proportionate deductions of monthly fee and hostel rent, where applicable.

In case, if a student leaves after joining the Course and if the vacated seat is not filled, the Educational Agency can collect the current year fees and should refund the security deposit and return the original documents. Institution should not demand fee for the subsequent years from the students cancelling their admission at any point of time.

The starting of the courses will be 1st August and the last date of admission shall be 15<sup>th</sup> August for the purpose of refund cases, unless otherwise decided.

19. Graduates with Mathematics/Physics as main and Diploma holders in Engineering will be allowed Lateral Entry Admission as per AICTE norms.

20. No consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any student admitted by the Educational Agency to the College. It shall be the liability of the Association and the Educational Agency jointly and severally to redress complaints from the students, parents or interested parties on any matter other than those covered by the terms and conditions of this agreement. Where the second party fails to redress any complaints referred to as above or on any matter covered under this agreement, it shall be the duty of the Government to take such steps as required to redress the complaint.

21. In case, any of the Educational Agency violates the provisions of this Agreement or collect any fee in excess of what is provided under this Agreement, the Admission Supervisory Committee (ASC) shall initiate proceedings against such Educational Agency for imposing penalty and/or recommending for the withdrawal of Affiliation by the University concerned.

22. The structure of fee and sharing of seats prescribed in this agreement is applicable to the Academic Year 2018-19 only.



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



Higher Education - Technical - Admission to Professional Degree Courses for the academic year 2018-19 - Fee structure and Allotment of seats by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in the Self Financing Architecture Colleges under Architecture College Management Association (ACMA) - Orders issued.

**ORDER**

The Prospectus for Admission to Professional Degree Courses, Kerala 2018 has been approved by the Government vide Government Order read as first paper above.

2. As per the clause 1.7 of the Prospectus "Allotment of seats from the Rank lists for all courses in Self-financing Colleges will be made in accordance with the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/High Court of Kerala or orders of the Government of Kerala/Government of India as per the law in existence at the time of Centralised Allotment Process (CAP) and will be notified separately."

3. Government vide 2nd paper above entered into an agreement with Architecture College Management Association (ACMA) representing 26 (Twenty Six) Private Architecture College Managements for seat sharing, tuition fee payable, collection of interest-free deposits and other charges for the academic year 2018-19 in respective colleges.

4. In the circumstances, Government are pleased to approve the Agreement and publish the major clauses of the Agreement with regard to the fee structure and allotment of seats for information, appropriate action and compliance by all concerned.

1. 50% seats in the member-colleges are set apart to be filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations from the list prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in accordance with merit and reservation principles followed by Government from time to time. The remaining 50% seats will be filled up by the Managements of the Member Colleges. Of this, 35% of the seats will be filled up by



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the Managements and the remaining 15% of the seats will be filled up by the Managements from the Non Resident Indian category.

2. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall issue notifications, invite options and allotments on the Centralized Allotment Process and these shall be done simultaneously for all the Architecture Colleges, whether Government/ Aided / Un-aided/ Government Self - Financing / Private Self Financing under Catholic Engineering College Management Association, under Kerala Self Financing Engineering College Management Association, and Architecture College Management Association, etc.

3. Non - Keralite Category II (NK II) Candidates are eligible for Admission to both Government Seats and Management Seats in Private Self-financing Colleges. Candidates who do not come under 'Keralite' or 'Non Keralite' category I' will be categorised as 'Non Keralite Category II (NK II)'. The explanations and definitions of these are explained, defined and approved vide Government of Kerala Order No. G.O.(MS) No.39/2018/H.Edn dated 30-01-2018.

Commissioner for Entrance Examinations has to include these students options in the CAP/Centralised Allotment Process to the Member Colleges based on their option submission. However they will not be eligible for Communal/Special/Persons with disabilities reservation or any fee concessions.

4. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall be free to make any number of allotments. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will assign only such students for admission to a College who are finally allotted to that College. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall complete all allotments as decided by him before the 25th day of July 2018. The last date for such students to join the respective colleges will be 26th day of July 2018. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will not re-allot students already allotted to a College and admitted in the College either by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations or the Management after this final allotment.

5. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the lists of the students to be admitted in the College by the Educational Agency and the Educational Agency shall admit the students specified in the lists. The students in the lists will be given specific instruction as to the date and time of presenting themselves before the College for admission, the amount of fees to be paid, the amount of refundable deposit to be remitted, and the records to be submitted at the time of admission. The Educational agency shall admit the students who have complied with the instructions as required by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the allotment lists of the students to be admitted to the Member Colleges on or before the 25th day of July 2018. The Commissioner will not re-allot students already allotted in the Member Colleges after this final allotment.

6. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall not allot any student to the Educational Agency after the 25th day of July 2018. The Educational agency shall be entitled to fill the seats remaining unfilled in Member Colleges after the 26th day of July 2018 and these seats that remain unfilled in the Government quota will be available to the Educational Agency as Additional Seats and the Educational Agency shall fill up those seats from among the applications received in the college, subject to merit and academic excellence of the applicants.

7. The students allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall remit Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) of the first year tuition fee at the Specified bank and such amount shall be retained by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. For the students admitted in the Member Colleges based on the allotment of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, rest of the tuition fee and special fee, any statutory fee and any other miscellaneous fee shall be paid by the student directly in the college at the time of admission in the college based on the final allotment of the student. The amount retained by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in respect of each student shall be paid to the Colleges before the 30th day of September 2018.

8. Where a student has at the time of admission remitted fees as specified in the Table below, but found eligible for the Lower Fees specified in the Table below, the Management is liable to return the excess fee realized from the student within one week of the intimation of such concession by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, and the Management shall be liable to pay interest to the Student at 18% per annum for any delay over this stipulated period of one week. Furthermore, where the student has been admitted to a College after the first allotment but has subsequently been allotted to another college on the basis of the second allotment, the Management is liable to return the entire fee remitted, by the student, if any, by way of Cash or Demand Draft after proper acknowledgement, within three days of the second allotment, failing which the Management shall be liable to pay interest to the student at 18% per annum for any delay over this stipulated period.

9. The fee structure applicable to the seats under the categories mentioned below in the Member Colleges, shall be as given below and this annual fees shall be the same for all the five years of study for the student admitted in 2018-19.

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In the event of seats being partially filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, students admitted to half of the seats allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, will pay tuition fees of Rs.55,000/- (Rupees Fifty Five Thousand only) - and Special Fee of 25000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only). And the other half will pay Tuition Fee of Rs. 55,000/- (Rupees Fifty Five Thousand only). Out of the students opting to a member college, students admitted under SC/ST/OEC and students identified for fee concession under lower income group based on the lower annual family income shall be included in the lower fee category.

10. In the case of SC/ST/OEC students allotted under Government Quota all the fees shall be paid by the Government.

11. In case any student remit the Interest Free Refundable Deposit, out of any Bank Loan, the respective College will stand guarantee for the return of the deposit to the Bank and in such cases, the College will refund the deposits only to the Banks. The Students will have to give the interest portion of such deposits directly to the Banks Concerned.

12. The Educational Agency shall be entitled to collect from every student admitted to the College irrespective of whether they have been allotted by Commissioner for Entrance Examinations under reservation or otherwise or by the Management, Caution Deposit of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) and such other permitted amounts at the rates stipulated by the respective University, from students joining in Member Colleges. The Management will be entitled to collect from each student up to, but not more than Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) per annum towards the value added courses and special facilities, if any provided by the Management. Such fees and amounts shall be specifically listed out in the prospectus and published each year by the Member College. The Association and the Educational Agency hereby undertake not to collect any amount from any student so admitted, other than those specified above. 1. 50% seats in the member colleges are set apart to be filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations from the list prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in accordance with merit and reservation principles followed by Government from time to time. The remaining 50% seats will be filled up by the Managements of the Member Colleges. Of this, 35% of the seats will be filled up by the Managements and the remaining 15% of the seats will be filled up by the Managements from the Non Resident Indian category.

13. Out of the 50% category of seats filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall allot 15% of the total seats from among the students belonging to the Community/ Registered Society/

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Registered Trust to which the Educational Agency belongs on the basis of merit. For allotment under these categories, every Member College shall inform the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations regarding the community, criteria for eligibility and documents to be submitted for the same.

This right is at the option of the Educational Agency. Those students who are seeking admission under the Community/Registered Society/Registered Trust Quota shall apply to the respective college and the college shall submit the list of such candidates to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on or before the date notified by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. In this regard, the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall prepare an online management system to facilitate the College Managements to update, validate and upload the details of the applicants who seek admission under the Community/Registered Society/Registered Trust Quota. Necessary notification in this regard shall be issued by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. If sufficient numbers of candidates are not available under this category, the balance seats will be available as State Merit seats for allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations during the online counselling.

14. The Educational Agency shall be entitled to fill up those seats still remaining unfilled after the closure of allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations for the seats set apart for allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. These unfilled seats from Government side shall be available to the Educational Agency as additional seats for admission and the Educational Agency can fill up those seats as per clause 15 from candidates who applied in that College.

15. The Educational Agency shall fill up 50% of the total seats from among students who satisfy the prescribed criteria of academic eligibility for admissions. The Educational Agency shall admit and fill up 35% seats from the applications received by the Educational Agency on the basis of merit list prepared based on the marks obtained in the qualifying examination and marks secured in the National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA).

16. However, each Member College shall be bound to report to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, the seats remaining unfilled after the admissions subsequent to the second allotment. If any Member College fails in so furnishing the exact details of unfilled seats, then all the seats, for which the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations has allotted students for any course of a Member College, shall be deemed to have been filled. Seats that are not reported to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on the date specified after the admissions are to be closed following the second allotment shall not be available for filling up as additional seats for admission as stipulated in the previous paragraph. Furthermore, default in reporting such unfilled seats shall be deemed to be a violation of this Agreement, and the first party shall have the right including retaining the share of the tuition fee remitted by the student with the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, recommending to the University for cancellation of affiliation of the course for which

such admissions have been made in breach of this Agreement and for withholding permission for the renewal of validity of the course for the succeeding years.

17. The Educational Agency is entitled to fill up 15% seats in the NRI category (NRI) by admitting qualified students who are dependents of Non Resident Indians as per the Section 2(6) of Act XIX of 2006. All these students have to qualify National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA) and to satisfy the prescribed conditions of academic eligibility.

18. In the event of a student withdrawing before the starting of the Course, the entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than ₹1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) shall be refunded by the Educational Agency.

In case, if a student leaves after joining the Course and if the vacated seat is consequently filled by another student by the last date of admission, the Educational Agency must refund the fee collected after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than ₹1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) and proportionate deductions of monthly fee and hostel rent, where applicable.

In case, if a student leaves after joining the Course and if the vacated seat is not filled, the Educational Agency can collect the current year fees and should refund the security deposit and return the original documents. Institution should not demand fee for the subsequent years from the students canceling their admission at any point of time.

The starting of the courses will be 1st August and the last date of admission shall be 15th August for the purpose of refund cases, unless otherwise decided.

19. The Agreement is valid for the academic year 2018-2019 only and shall not prejudicially affect the rights of the parties by virtue of the clauses herein, in respect of the cases pending before any Court of Law.

20. No consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any student admitted by the educational agency to the college. It shall be the liability of the Association and the Educational Agency jointly and severally to redress complaints from the students, parents of interested parties on any matter other than those covered by the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Where the second party fails to redress any complaints referred to as above or on any matter covered under this agreement, it shall be the duty of the First party to take such steps as required to redress the complaint.

21. In case any of the Managements violates the provisions of this Agreement or any fee in excess of what is provided under the Agreement, the admission Supervisory

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Committee shall initiate proceedings against such Managements for imposing penalty, recommending for the withdrawal of Affiliation by the University concerned etc.

22. It is clarified that all private Self-Financing Architecture Colleges who are now part of Architecture College management Association (ACMA) which entered into this Agreement need not be required to enter into separate agreement for the year 2018-2019 in respect of those course covered under the respective agreements entered into with them.

Accordingly Non Objection Certificate granted to all private Self financing Architecture Colleges that are now part of Architecture College Management Association (ACMA) need not be renewed this year as was applicable last year and shall be valid for the year 2018-2019. However, if the member colleges get new courses/increase in intake they have to enter into separate agreement with Government.

The structure of fee and sharing of seats prescribed in this order is applicable to the academic year 2018-19 only.
