ORDER

Government of Kerala had revised the norms of relief assistance from State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) to the victims of natural calamities for 2015-20 in accordance with the recommendations of 14th Finance Commission (FFC) approved by Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs as per Government Order read as 2nd paper above. As per the revised norms issued by Govt. of India vide letter read as 1st paper above, it has been permitted to use 10% of the annual SDRF/NDRF allocation for relief assistance to 'State Specific Disasters' within the local context of the State and instructed that such local disasters and the relief assistance norms have to be declared and approved by the State Executive Committee (SEC) of State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA).

- 2) Accordingly the SEC has declared the following items as State Specific Local Distasters and approved the norms for relief assistance as given as annexure to this order.
 - a) Lightning
 - b) Coastal erosion, and
 - c) Strong wind less than cyclone or cyclonic storms which causes damages to life and property.
- 3) The Government have examined the matter and are pleased to order that the norms and scale of assistance declared and approved by the SEC of KSDMA and given as annexure to this order will be followed for providing relief assistance to victims of State Specific Disasters in the State. This order will have retrospective effect from 1.4.2015.

ORDER

As per Government Orders read above, the undersigned, in exercise of the powers conferred under section 20 (3) of the Disaster Management Act 2005, in his capacity as Chairperson, State Executive Committee, State Disaster Management, has extended the lock down in the State from 17th to 23rd May-2021 as a measure to contain the spread of COVID-19 pandemic.

In addition to the exemptions to lock down already ordered therein, following are ordered for strict compliance:

- Textiles and jewellery shops are permitted to open with limited staff for home delivery/online delivery of clothes/jewellery. Wedding parties can be allowed in the shop upto 1 hour.
- ii. Free food kits shall be distributed to the fishermen community, who lost their livelihood due the lock down and cyclone, utilizing funds from SDRF.
- iii. The Tax Consultants and GST practitioners can function on Thursday and Friday for payments of GST returns and tax payments without late fee.
- iv. Migrant workers shall be allowed for pineapple collection and related works.
- v. Since telecom is an essential service, tower related works shall be permitted.

Any persons violating the regulations will be liable to be proceeded against

<u>ORDER</u>

As per the letter read above, Director of Fisheries has informed that in the wake of the cyclone 'Tauktae', the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority banned fishing on the state's coast from 13/05/2021 to till further notice and requested to release an amount of Rs 18,36,48,000/- from SDRF for providing an assistance of Rs 1200/- to each of registered 1,24,970 Nos of marine fishermen families and 28,070 Nos of registered Allied Fishermen families @ Rs 200/- per day for a period of six days from 13/05/2021 to 18/05/2021.

Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to release an amount of Rs.18,36,48,000/-(Eighteen crore thirty six lakh forty eight thousand only) to Director of Fisheries from the head of account 2245-02-101-94-01 Flood other items under SDRF. Finance Officer, Disaster Management Department shall take urgent action to disburse the above amount to Director of Fisheries to the STSB account No 701011400000189 maintained at District Treasury, Thiruvananthapuram

The fund should be utilized only for the purpose for which it is allotted. The amount should be utilized from the current year budget provision subject to the conditions laid down in the SDRF norms. The expenditure details should be uploaded in the NDMIS portal with in the month of the expenditure.
