REPORT

This Report deals with the Action Taken by the Government on the recommendations contained in the 163rd Report of the Committee on Public Accounts (2008-2011).

The 163rd Report of the Committee on Public Accounts (2008-2011) was presented to the House on 23rd February, 2011. The Report contained 26 recommendations pertaining to Home Department. The Report was forwarded to Government on 1-3-2011 to furnish the statement of action taken on the recommendations contained in the Report and the final reply was received on 30-10-2023.

The Committee considered and approved the Action Taken Statements at its meetings held on 18-2-2015, 27-12-2016, 8-9-2021 and 29-12-2023 and decided not to pursue further action on the recommendations in the light of the replies furnished by the Government.

The recommendations of the Public Accounts Committee (2008-2011) contained in the 163rd Report and the Action Taken by Government on the recommendations are included in this Report.

HOME DEPARTMENT

Recommendation

(Sl.No. 1, Para No. 10)

In connection with the defalcation of Rs. 39.65 lakh through 13 GPF bills of the office of the Superintendent of Police (SP), Crime Branch (CBCID), Palakkad the Committee felt displeased in the disclosure of the witness that responsible officials are charged with only supervisory lapse and all the guilt is put on the shoulder of the clerk who later committed suicide. The Committee expresses suspicion over the genuineness of the Vigilance enquiry aimed to safeguard the delinquent officers. The Committee directs the department to furnish all the details of the vigilance report. Since Superintendent of Police and the Treasury Officer are also collectively responsible for the embezzlement, the Committee insists to take disciplinary action against all of them and to recover the defalcated amount from them.

Action taken

As per the report of Director, Vigilance & Anti- Corruption Bureau following officers are also responsible for the offence.

1. Smt. P. Valsala, Junior Superintendent
2. Smt. Sosamma Joseph, Cahier, CBCID, Palakkad
3. Sri. A. Suresh Kumar, Section Clerk, District Treasury, Palakkad
4. Sri. Velayudhan, Junior Superintendent.

The findings of Director, Vigilance & Anti-Corruption Bureau is that Smt. Valsala had direct supervision over F1 section and Cash Transaction. She should have properly verified bill book and GPF book prepared by late K. Krishnakumar, Clerk. For this lapse, Smt. Valsala has been punished by barring 2 increments without cumulative effect by the Additional Director General of Police. However, in appeal Government have reduced the punishment by barring increment for 1 year vide GO (Rt.) No. 1731/2011/Home dated: 10-6-2011.

Recommendation

(Sl.No. 2 Para No. 11)

The Committee observes serious breach of rule in a number of cases such as the superintendent of police had passed bills amounting to ₹ 15 lakh crossing over his empowered financial power to pass only ₹ 1 lakh, there has been erasures and corrections in the Bill Book and missing of pages of Bill Book, amounts sanctioned by incompetent officers etc. The Committee blames the performance of the Internal Audit Wing of the department and enquired whether necessary inspections had been conducted to assess such malpractices. The Committee strongly recommends to strengthen the Internal Audit Wing by including trained officials.

Action taken

Smt. Sosamma Joseph was the cashier at that time. As per the office order the cashier had to write the Treasury bill book. She allowed Sri Krishnakumar to make entries in the treasury bill book regarding details of GPF advance. This failure on the part of her helped the accused in the commission of offence.

The Superintendent, CBCID has, initiated Disciplinary action by issuing memo of charges on 2-5-2007. An enquiry was also being ordered. In the enquiry report charges has been proved. She retired on superannuation on 31-1-2008. Since she was retired the case was referred to Government for taking action under rule 3 part (iii) KSR. Government has decided to proceed case further agreeing with findings of enquiry officer. It has been tentatively decided to reduce ₹500 from her pension permanently under rule 3 part (iii) KSR and SCN issued accordingly. The matter is under consideration of Government.

₹ 13 lakhs was fixed as liability against treasury staff, Sri Suresh Kumar, Senior Accountant, and Velayudhan, Junior Superintendent who were found responsible by the Vigilance Department.

As per the Vigilance enquiry report, former clerk, Sri Krishnakumar (late), alone is responsible for embezzlement of Government money. The Public Accountants Act has been invoked to recover the defalcated amount from legal heirs of late Sri Krishnakumar. The total defalcated amount is assessed to be ₹26,65,550. All the movable and immovable properties were attached and confiscated. So far as from available records, ₹ 12,04,665 has been recovered and remitted to the District Treasury. 3.5 acres and 19.25 cents of land is also subjected to auction.

So far, out of ₹ 26,65,550 which is calculated as liability to Police Department, ₹ 12,04,665 has been recovered from legal heirs of late Krishnakumar by confiscating movable and immovable properties. The balance amount of ₹ 14,60,885 has yet to be recovered.

As per the 163rd Report of Para 10, 11, PAC expressed suspicion over the genuineness of the vigilance enquiry aimed to safeguard the delinquent officers and insists to take disciplinary action against all the officials collectively responsible for the embezzlement and to recover the defalcated amount from them. Government forwarded the recommendations of PAC, to SPC, Keala for further action. On the basis of PAC report, Internal Audit Wing of Police Headquarters has conducted a verification of GPF temporary advance bill and in view of the report of Audit Wing, SPC, Kerala reported that the forgery was presumably not committed by the deceased Clerk, Krishna Kumar all by himself. SPC, informed

that they have taken up the matter with Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau for further verification in view of the report of Internal Audit Wing. SPC, Kerala, later informed that Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau hesitates to inquire further into the case since Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau had conducted a detailed investigation and findings of the investigation was accepted by Government. Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau also recommend a CBCID enquiry on the basis of audit report of internal audit wing, Police Headquarters. ADGP (Crimes) is of the opinion that scientific verification of signature in the forged bills cannot be done in an enquiry by CBCID and if further verification is required as called for by the SPC and Government it may be legally done by Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau. The SPC, Kerala recommended to give direction to Director, Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau to verify the points raised by Police Headquarters.

Action is being pursued for investigating the matter by the Vigilance and Anti – Corruption Bureau. Stringent action in this regard will be taken and the defalcated amount will also be recovered from the delinquent officers soon after the receipt of the report in this regard from the Director, Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau.

Further Recommendation

(Paras No. 10 & 11)

The Committee considered the SOAT and directed to seek explanation from the Secretary, Home Department on not conducting enquiry even after recommended by the Committee and also on not complying the recommendation to strengthen the internal audit wing.

Action taken

Recommendation

(Sl No.3, Para No. 66)

The Committee expresses utter dissatisfaction over the shortfall in expenditure from 2002-03 to 2006-07 which amounted to ₹ 44.28 crore. The Committee notes that the deposit of ₹ 21.30 crores with PWD for civil works was also included in expenditure and the non expenditure of ₹ 104.95 lakh allotted to PWD for various works during 1998 to 2006. The Committee demands to submit a detailed report of all matters including the pending works, completed works, shortfall in expenditure, unspent amount etc, at the earliest.

Action taken

The detailed report of various works amount deposited with PWD are shown in Annexure III.

Action taken

Recommendation of the Committee is noted for future guidance.

The detailed report regarding the pending works, completed works, shortfall in expenditure, unspent amount etc. is attached. (Annexure IV)

Recommendation

(Sl No.4, Para No. 67)

The Committee understands that the custody, detention and security of Prisoners being the basic function of prisons are not properly executed due to the following up of outdated rules, procedures and practices. Therefore, the Committee strongly recommends framing a unified act as suggested by the Jail reforms Committees in consultation with the Law Department so as to suit the current needs. The Committee further recommends to updating the Jail Manual also.

Action taken

By unique unification of Kerala Prisons Act 1894 and Travancore Cochin Prisons Act-1960, Kerala Prisons and Correctional Management Act 2010 was enacted. It came into force w.e.f. 1-1-2011. Draft Prison Rules are being framed.

Recommendation

(Sl No.5, Para No. 68)

The Committee observes from the audit findings that sufficient facilities are not provided for meeting visitors contrary to jail manual and therefore recommends construction of meeting rooms for visitors with facilities of screens and wire mesh in all jails as envisaged in relevant rules.

Action taken

There are 52 jails in the State. At present such facilities are in place in the following jails only.

1. Central Prison, Thiruvananthapuram
2. Central Prison, Viyyur
3. Central Prison, Kannur
4. Special Sub Jail, Thiruvananthapuram
5. Special Sub Jail, Neyyattinkara
6. Special Sub Jail, Kannur
7. Sub Jail, Pathanamthitta
8. Sub Jail, Ernakulam
9. Sub Jail, Tirur
10. Sub Jail, Irinjalakkuda
11. District Jail, Kozhikode
12. Sub Jail, Manjeri

In other jails temporary security arrangements have been made in the visitor's room. Visitors are allowed to interact with prisoners only in the presence of jail officers to prevent exchange of contraband articles.

Further Recommendation

The Committee further reiterated its earlier recommendation to construct meeting rooms for visitors with facilities of screen and wire mesh in all jails as envisaged in relevant rules.

Action taken

Administrative Sanction had been accorded for the construction of Interview Hall in 3 Central Prisons with Modern Facilities during the Financial Year 2017-18. Consequently, amount had been deposited to PWD and further necessary action is being taken in this regard. A proposal has been submitted to Central Government to allot the necessary amount (₹ 37.51 lakhs) to facilitate help desks in all jails which will be helpful to the visitors of prisoners in jail.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 6, Para No. 69)

The Committee expresses its concern on the improper maintenance of Gate Register as well as supplying of insufficient quantity of food items to prisoners violating the provisions in Kerala Prison Rules and directed the department to revise the diet scale, avoiding of wastage of food items, ensure the proper maintenance of Gate Register etc. The Committee also seeks disciplinary action against those responsible officials for this lapse.

Action taken

Diet scale has since been modified. The age old wheat ball is no more served in jails. Prisoner are served chappathy and curry. One additional curry is also being supplied now. Wastage of food material was mainly on account of monotony of food items.

Gate Registers are maintained in all jails.

Further Recommendation

Considering the above para the Committee expressed its strong displeasure for not taking disciplinary action against the officials responsible for the lapse.

Action taken

Diet Scales has been revised as per the provisions in Kerala Prisons & Correctional Services (Management) Act, 2014. Diet Rolls & Stock Registers are maintained for supplying of sufficient quantity of food items to prisoners without violating the provisions of Kerala Prisons & Correctional Services (Management) Act, 2014. The Superintendent and the officers concerned assure that sufficient quantity of food items supplied to the prisoners. No grievances are reported from the prisoners relating to the supplying of food items.

Gate Registers are maintained properly in all jails and the same is verified by the Superintendents concerned.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 7, Para No. 70)

The Committee recommends the Government to implement biometric finger identification system in all Jails after finding that the convict number/Register number of all convicts are not marked in their bedding and clothing.

Action taken

Thumb impression and photograph of prisoners used to be taken at the time of admission. Biometric identification has not been implemented because of costs involved.

Further Recommendation

The Committee rejected the department stand that biometric identification system has not been implemented because of cost involvement and reiterated its recommendation that biometric identification system should be installed in all Jails.

Action taken

Bio Metric Finger Print Scanner has been implemented for the inmates in Central Prison, Thiruvananthapuram, as part of implementing e-prison project in Prisons in Kerala through National Information Centre (NIC). A proposal has been submitted to Central Government to allot amount to purchase connected equipments including finger print scanners, computers etc., as part of implementing e-prison completely.

Central Government have allotted an amount of Rs. 1.77 crores based on the proposal submitted to implement e-prison project in Jails. As per the Government order, G.O. (Rt.) No.534/2019/Home dated: 19-2-2019, Administrative sanction was accorded to the project.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 8, Para No. 71)

The Committee severely criticises the mixing up of convicts and undertrials in the same cells and suspects that such non segregation would result in serious consequences as the undertrials might bring ganja, mobile phones etc. from outside and recommends segregation of undertrials and convicts in Jails.

Action taken

To avoid the mingling of convicted prisoners and under trial prisoners, new 14 jails have been started.

1. Open Prison, Cheemeni
2. Women's Prison, Kannur
3. Special Sub Jail, Kannur
4. Special Sub Jail, Kozhikode
5. Sub Jail, Hosdurg
6. Jail, Chittur
7. Jail, Vyyur

8. Sub Jail Mananthavady
9. Special Sub Jail, Thiruvananthapuram
10. Borstal School, Thrikkakara
11. District Jail, Ernakulam
12. District Jail, Kannur
13. Women's Prison, Viyur
14. Special Sub Jail, Neyyattinkara

The jail at Mananthavady has been recovered and restarted. An additional block was added at Mavelikkara, three storeyed blocks were added at District Jail, Thiruvananthapuram and Kollam and accommodation capacity in Central Prison, Viyur has been increased by constructing new blocks. The total accommodation capacity of jails has increased from 4107 to 6471. As a result segregation of convicted prisoners and under trial prisoners are achieved to a higher extent.

Further Recommendation

Considering the action taken on this para the Committee strongly recommended that segregation of convicted prisoners and undertrials should be achieved to the full extent by enhancing the facilities.

Action Taken

In all major Jails, remand prisoners and convicted prisoners are lodged separately.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 9, Para No. 72)

The Committee was convinced in the shortage of strength of warders and directs the authorities to reduce the period of training from 9 months to 6 months and recommends imparting time-bound training to all permanent employees of Jail Department by increasing the number of training centres.

Action Taken

Reducing the period of training of Warder from 9 months to six months is not advisable. All the executive wings like Police, Fire & Rescue Service Excise etc. provide basic training for a period of 9 months.

The State Institute of Correctional Administration is the institute intended for imparting training to the Warder staff of the jail Department. SICA is situated in Trivandrum and has the capacity to train only 60 personnel at a time. Considering this inadequacy Government vide G.O.(Ms.) No. 176/2010/Home dated 31-7-2010 (Copy attached) issued Administrative Sanction for the establishment of SICA Regional Centres at Kannur and Viyyur. Now the three SICA Centres put together can train 180 trainees at a time.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 10, Para No. 73)

The Committee also recommends fixing the ratio of sanctioned strength of Warders to be appointed on the basis of the strength of prisoners during the previous year.

Recommendation

(Sl. No.11, Para No. 74)

The Committee was dissatisfied with the lack of uniformity among Warder establishment and Prison capacity and strongly recommends that a standardised approach should be made to fix the staff strength according to the strength of prisoners of the previous years and also directed to effect transfer from places having surplus staff to stations where there is shortage of staff.

Action Taken of Paras 73 & 74

Government as per G.O. (Rt.) No. 2949/11/Home dated: 3-10-2012 accorded sanction to the Additional Director General of Police (Prisons) to redistribute the warder staff in various prisons according to actual requirement. In principle there has to be one guarding staff for every six prisoners.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 12, Para No. 75)

The Committee views the unnecessary detention of undertrials in various jails as a serious violation of human rights and directs to issue charge sheets to convicts who were not issued the same. The Committee strongly recommends to taking up these matters before the Jail Committee and directs settling of all such cases including non charge sheeted cases, especially the case of a 19 years long imprisonment of an undertrial and submit report accordingly.

Action Taken

District Level Committees are functioning effectively meeting once in every 3 months to review the cases of remand prisoners who remain in jails for more than 3 months. So unnecessary detention is avoided. The District Session Judge is the Chairman and the jail Superintendent. Superintendent of Police and District Probation Officer are members of the District Level Committee. In compliance with the orders of the Hon'ble High Court, under trail prisoners released.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 13, Para No. 76)

The Committee recommends urgent follow up action or revenue recovery proceedings in cases of non return of convict prisoners after parole. The Committee also instructs that broad guidelines should be framed to identify the real cases of unhealthy prisoners in 'sinking stage' and mentioned that paroles shall be granted only on Police recommendations as per the rules framed by the Subject Committee.

Action Taken

An amount of 15 lakhs has to be recovered. In order to realize the amount from the sureties, legal action from the Revenue Authorities is sought.

Rules related to the granting of parole has been amended as per order G.O.(P.) No. 18/2008/Home dated 18-1-2008 in order to comply with the

direction of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in its judgment criminal M.C. 400/2001 dated 4-6-2002. As per the above rule recommendation of the Sub Inspector of Police concerned is compulsory for granting parole. Provisions have also been included in the above mentioned rule to consider the premature release of unhealthy prisoners in a sinking condition.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 14, Para No. 77)

On understanding the facilities and privileges of prisoners and overcrowding in Jails, the Committee recommends to take necessary steps to enhance the capacity in jails by ascertaining the increase in the number of prisoners during the previous five years and fixing the ground space as 3.72 sq.m. and sufficient breathing space as envisaged in Kerala Prison Rules.

Action Taken

Accommodation facility of the jails of Kerala has been recast according to the standard minimum rules fixed by the UNO ie. 3.72 sq.mtr. Ground area and 7.62 cm Air. Through setting up new jails/additional barracks and reopening of closed jails capacity of the jails of Kerala has been enhanced to 6471 from 3468.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 15, Para No. 78)

The Committee recommends that a Medical Officer and supporting staff should be posted immediately at Open Jail, Nettukaltheri and District Medical Officers should visit the District Jails as specified in Rules. The Committee also recommends that suitable disciplinary action should be taken against those District Medical Officers who fail to make these visits.

Action Taken

Directions have already been given to the Director of Health Services regarding the posting of a Medical Officer and supporting staff in the Open Prison, Nettukaltheri and the visit of District Medical Officers to the District Jails as specified in rules.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 16, Para No. 79)

The Committee directs urgent steps to be taken to facilitate the sterilisation of clothes of prisoners in all Jails and suggested to fix the term of Jail Advisory Board as two years or the Constitution of the succeeding Board whichever is earlier.

Action Taken

Steps have already been taken for the sterilization of clothes of prisoners by providing soap, phenyl etc. Dress materials are sterilized in hot water before issuing to the prisoners. Government have issued orders enhancing the term of Jail Advisory Board from two years to three years as per G.O.(P.) No. 18/2008/Home dated 18-1-2008.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 17, Para No. 80)

Regarding the reformation, rehabilitation and welfare of prisoners, the Committee recommends that importance should be given to provide necessary training to prisoners in the repairing and assembling of electrical and electronic equipments to improve their chances of employment after release as suggested in the Report of the Jail Reforms Committee 1993.

Action Taken

Prisoners are provided with training in the following trades both traditional and modern, to improve their chances of employment after their release.

1. Carpentry
2. Weaving Unit
3. Tailoring Unit
4. Shoe making

5. Printing
6. Book binding
7. Masonry
8. Blacksmith
9. Rubber tapping
10. Soap making
11. Floriculture
12. Mushroom Cultivation
13. Phenyl Making
14. Chappathi Making
15. Vermi Compost
16. Cattle rearing
17. Pig Farm
18. Poultry Farm
19. Bee Keeping
20. Goat rearing
21. Organic Vegetable Cultivation
22. Computer training
23. Laterite Stone cutting
24. Rubber Nursery

It is proposed to start an “M Sand Unit” Holobrick unit and Ready mix concrete unit for providing training to the prisoners.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 18, Para No. 81)

The Committee recommends the immediate constitution of Board of Visitors in every prison in the State as required under Kerala Prison Rules so that proper management of prisons could be ensured.

Action Taken

The new Prison Act namely Kerala Prisons & Correctional Services (Management) Act 2010 has been enacted as on 1-1-2011. Based on this, new draft Prison Rules are under consideration of Government. When the same is approved, constitution of Board of visitors in every prison in the State will be ensured.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 19, Para No. 82)

The Committee expresses displeasure over the improper maintenance of cash books and recommends maintaining proper accounts in the case of sale of agricultural products, remittances in Treasury and income of prisoners.

Action Taken

Direction has already been issued to the concerned Jail Superintendent for maintaining Cash Book properly. On verification of audit, it is seen that most of the Superintendents maintain the Cash Book properly, corrective steps will be taken wherever called for.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 20, Para No. 83)

The Committee recommends that Government should ensure timely utilisation of GoI funds by effective co-ordination between the Department of Prisons and Public Works Department to avoid loss of Central Assistance.

Action Taken

Noted for future guidance.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 21, Para No. 84)

The Committee opines that Modern scientific methods should be employed for identification of prisoners and security, surveillance and communication systems upgraded.

Action Taken

As part of increasing security measures and for identification of prisoners the following Modern scientific methods have been introduced in Jails.

1. Mobile phone jammers introduced in Central Prison, Kannur.

2. CCTV Surveillance System installed in Central Prison, Kannur and Central Prison, Thiruvananthapuram.

3. Installation of Video Conferencing System linking the Courts and jails of Thiruvananthapuram, Ernakulam, Kottayam, Thrissur Districts has been completed. The installation work of video conferencing system in Kannur District is in progress. In the remaining 9 Districts, the system will be installed during the current financial year, meeting the expenditure from the funds under 13th Finance Commission Award.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 22, Para No. 85)

The Committee suggests that the department should take co-ordinated action with the Public Works Department for the Speedy Completion of new Jails.

Action Taken

Speedy action and regular follow up action with Public Works Department is ensured for completion of the construction work in a time bound manner.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 23, Para No. 86)

The Committee vexatiously views the lack of required height of 6 metre for compound walls in many jails in the State and demands the details regarding the schemes intended to increase the height of small compound walls.

Action Taken

The construction and heightening of compound wall in the jails included under 13th Finance Commission Award and an amount of ₹ 8.05 crore has been earmarked for the same during the 2012-13.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 24, Para No. 87)

Regarding the forfeiture of security deposit in the case of absconding of prisoners in Parole, the Committee recommends recovery of the security deposit from the guarantor irrespective of whether the convict has been recaptured or not. The Committee also demands revenue recovery proceedings to be initiated in all such cases.

Action Taken

Directions have been given to the Land Revenue Commissioner regarding the recovery of the security deposit from the guarantor and also the revenue recovery proceedings to be initiated in all such cases.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 25, Para No. 88)

The Committee likes to suggest that in the matter of shortage of ministerial staff steps should be taken to post additional staff in Open Jails and recommends that separate appointments should be made in the categories of drivers and ministerial staff.

Action Taken

The matter will be examined by Government.

Recommendation

(Sl. No. 26, Para No. 89)

The Committee understands that the lack of fencing results in encroachment of agricultural produce in Nettukaltheri Open Jail, and recommends to providing ample fencing around the Jail compound to prevent such incidents. The Committee also recommends that a Medical Officer should be appointed permanently in the Nettukaltheri Open Jail.

Action Taken

KPHCC Ltd. has completed the construction of barbed wire fencing in open prison Nettukaltheri on 12-11-2010 and submitted the completion certificate. The Directorate of Health Services has been instructed to make necessary arrangements for the appointment of the Medical Officer.


