FOREWORD

The Gender Budget is an important component of the general policy effort of the Government of Kerala to ensure gender equality and women and children's rights. Gender issues and the general problems of women in different sectors of the economy are discussed with departments and stakeholders at every stage of the Annual Plan process.

The Gender Budget constitutes more than 20 per cent of the Plan Budget every year – that is in itself a remarkable achievement of the Government of Kerala. The Gender Budget now encompasses some of the best-performing schemes in the Budget.

The allocation of the Gender Budget 2025-26 is Rs. 4840.12 crore, or 20.8 per cent of the total Plan Budget of Rs. 23285 crore (excluding the allocation of Local Self Government Institutes). This is a year-on-year increase of 3.8 per cent in the allocation. The allocation for Part A schemes (which cover schemes that are 90-100 per cent women specific) is Rs. 2521.20 crore, and for Part B schemes (which covers all schemes that are 10-90 per cent women specific) is Rs. 2318.92 crore. Part A and Part B constitute 10.83 per cent and 9.96 per cent of the total Plan Budget.

The proposed Child Budget for 2025-26 is Rs. 1713.26 crore, or 7.36 per cent of the total Plan Budget. This represents an increase of 1.6 per cent over the amount allocated in 2024-25.

Kerala is the first State in India to announce a policy for the welfare of transgender persons. The relevant schemes cover education, health, livelihood and participation in the cultural sphere. The allocation for the welfare of transgender persons under various schemes in 2025-26 is Rs. 6.93 crore.

The Gender Budgeting process has been integrated into the Budget preparations by an internal team of the Kerala State Planning Board. Gender Budget 2025-26 was prepared by a team led by Ms. Mini Sukumar, Member, Kerala State Planning Board with the support of all Divisions. Pre-Budget discussions and interactions with officials from various departments, women's organisations, experts in the field and politicians were helpful in preparing the Gender Budget.

I commend the many persons who contributed to the preparation of the Gender Budget 2025-26 for their hard work and commitment.

2 : MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS:

GENDER BUDGET 2025-26

Kerala State is pioneering in mainstreaming Gender Budgeting into the annual planning and budgeting process. The state has succeeded in producing better outcomes for many gender-specific schemes and in making gender a priority concern in the major developmental sectors. It has made the budget more gender-sensitive and ensures public resources are used to attain gender equality. The emphasis is on improving women's well-being and livelihood conditions through government policies.

The annual Gender Budget Document of the State provides a detailed picture of public expenditure directed towards women, children, and transgender people by reviewing the gender components in the programmes designed by the various departments. Gender is a cross-cutting issue in many government programs, so cross-agency collaboration and program delivery by gender-responsive budgeting improves government expenditures. The gender budgeting process has been stabilised and mainstreamed in Kerala with a steady increase in allocations across traditional and non-traditional sectors. A central characteristic of gender-responsive budgeting initiatives is that they seek to improve the results of budgets generally, and gender equality and women's empowerment by focusing on key economic and social matters frequently overlooked or obscured in conventional budget and policy analysis, and decision-making. The pre-budget discussions of the State Planning Board with all the departments at two levels is a unique feature that supports the Gender Budgeting process. The state follows a Gender Budgeting practice of gender-informed resource allocation whereby gender assessments inform individual policy decisions and / or funding allocations by various departments. Kerala State Planning Board and the Finance Department, Government of Kerala in coordination with all the Government departments prepare the Gender Budget document along with the Annual Budget Document. The amount of financial resources allocated to gender-responsive policies varies substantially among reporting departments and sectors in absolute terms and as a share of total allocation. This process helps develop new gender-responsive schemes and increase financial allocations across sectors.

Despite the challenging fiscal situation of the state with decreasing central assistance and changing patterns of fund release in centrally assisted schemes; the State Government continues its commitment towards social security, development, and gender justice. This year the Gender Budget 2025 -26 has an allocation of **₹ 4840.12 Crores** (last year it was 4661.51) within a total plan outlay of **₹ 23285 Crores** (excluding the allocation to LSGIs).

This shows **20.79 percent** of the total plan outlay. Within this, Part A (that covers 90 to 100 percent women-specific schemes) has an allocation of **₹ 2521.20 crores (10.83 percent)**, and Part B (includes all the schemes in which the allocation of budgetary resources is anything less than 90 percent) has an allocation of **₹ 2318.92 crores (9.96 percent)**. This year, Part A Schemes show an increase in allocations. There is **an overall increase of 178.61 Cr** in allocations for gender-specific schemes in the annual plan 2025 -26. A small decrease is seen in the overall percentage. This is due to the proportional variation of the increase in the total plan size. The Part B schemes show a smaller reduction in allocation due to the successful completion of schemes for infrastructure facilities.

This time, the State Planning Board has conducted a review of all the schemes to understand their performance based on the feedback from the departmental side. Some of the schemes were completed, and some have been expanded. A few schemes were dropped because of feasibility issues, and they were directed to redesign. A report on the performance of gender budget schemes, including the success stories, will be released.

Gender Budget 2025-26, follows the same classification as the Gender Budget 2024-25 in presenting the schemes as (A) women's safety and gender mainstreaming; (B) education, skilling, and employment; (C) health and social security; (D) gender friendly infrastructure. Major highlights are presented below under these categories.

A. Women's Safety and Gender Mainstreaming

1. Nirbhaya programs are implemented in the state based on State Nirbhaya Policy. A comprehensive approach is used to implement the functioning of various homes under WCD, including the model home, entry homes, and other support systems for POCSO survivors.
2. An immediate relief fund for survivors of violence has been implemented effectively in the state to provide immediate financial assistance to the victims of sex crimes, acid attacks, Domestic Violence (DV), Gender-Based Violence (GBV), and so on.
3. A programme named Menstrual hygiene initiative for empowering girls implemented last year will be continued in schools. This is to promote and ensure menstrual hygiene and awareness among girl students and is implemented as a component under the scheme Student Centric Activities in school education.
4. A new scheme *Establishment of Creches in the workplace as per the maternity benefit Act* is formulated through restructuring Anganwadi Centre to serve as a

crèche for children less than three years of age and as a preschool for children aged 3 to 6 years and also a safe place for adolescent girls after school hours who need a place of safety.

5. Community Policing – *Pink Protection Project* – was introduced in 2022-23 in the State for the protection of women in public, private, and digital spaces.
6. Psycho-social service for adolescent girls is an important ongoing scheme of the Women and Child Department. It aims to assist in engaging psycho-social counselors in schools and measures to upgrade their skills. This scheme has allocated 51.00 crores in the budget 2025-26 for expansion into more schools.
7. Kerala State Film Development Corporation (KSFDC) under the Department of Culture launched the initiative 'Cinema for Women Directors' in the financial year 2019-20 to increase the presence of women in leadership roles in the film industry. Rs. 3.00 crore rupees are allocated for the Cinema of Women Directors each year at the rate of 1.50 crore per film. Five films were produced over the last five years which received several awards and film festival entries within and outside the country.
8. International Film Festival Kerala 2024 (IFFK 2024) focused on female and queer perspective by screening 52 films directed by women and a range of films explored experiences of queer lives. The film 'Victoria' produced under the scheme 'Cinema for Women Directors' and directed by Sivaranjini.J received the FIPRESCI award for Best Malayalam film of a debut director at IFFK 2024.
9. *Samam* cultural initiative for gender equality by the Department of Culture intended to prevent the atrocities against women and children and to promote women's cultural expression is continuing.
10. A scheme named *Fellowships to Various Art Forms* was started under the Department of Culture with a strong women component for awarding fellowships to artists in various categories of folk arts, classical arts, performing arts, and fine arts through the Directorate of Culture.
11. State-wise vehicle tracking platform for safety and enforcement under Nirbhaya framework – to enhance the safety of women and girl children by equipping all the public passenger transport vehicles with intelligent devices and emergency buttons for raising alerts in case of emergency introduced in 2022-23 and continuing.
12. Gender Park, along with the heritage museum and gender library, has ensured continuous support for women. Gender Data Hub and an initiative for engendering

urban planning were also started with the support of UN Women.

13. A self-defence programme for girls through the promotion of sports disciplines like Kalarippayattu, Taekwondo, Judo, and Karate to equip our girls to save themselves from violence and enable them to excel in national and international tournaments is a continuing scheme in Sports and youth affairs.
14. Programmes for combating violence against women – *Bhoomika* (Medical care for victims of violence/social abuses, an immediate relief fund for victims of violence, psycho-social services for adolescent girls, 181 Women's Help Line, Swadhar *Greh* (institutional support for women victims of difficult circumstances) and *Ujjwala* (prevention of trafficking and to rescue, rehabilitate and reintegrate the victims) and Immediate relief fund for victims of violence are continuing schemes. Bodhyam – Gender Sensitization Training for Police Personnel is an ongoing program by KSWDC.
15. The Gender Advisory Council is supporting the Women and Child Development Department through guidance, monitoring, and research. Gender awareness programmes by the Women and Child Department (WCD), Kerala Women's Commission (KWC), Women's Development Corporation (WDC), and assistance to aftercare programmes are continuing schemes in the Gender Budget 2025-26.
16. Hub for Empowerment of Women (state share scheme for CSS), which aims to facilitate inter-sectoral convergence of schemes and programmes meant for women at the central, State, and district levels with the mandate to create an environment in which women realize their full potential.
17. Sakthisadan is a new central scheme implemented by WCD (60:40) for assisting rehabilitation, shelter, food, clothing, medical treatment, counseling, legal aid, guidance, vocation training, and support to enable readjustment with family / society, preventing trafficking through social mobilization and involvement of local communities, facilitate rescue of women from place of exploitation and place them in safe custody and facilitate repatriation of cross border victims to their native country
18. Women Volleyball Academy and Women Football Academy are two important continuing schemes by the Kerala Sports Council that enable the mainstreaming of women into sports and games.

B. Education, Skilling, and Employment

Schemes for Education, Skilling, and Employment constitute a major share of gender-responsive programmes. Budgetary allocations and quantity of programmes prove the importance of education and skilling that lead to gainful employment for women and make them self-reliant in life. Most of the departments have women-specific schemes and women components. There are special schemes for the transgender community, as well as schemes that include transgender people as beneficiaries. Many of the schemes are ongoing schemes that ensure continuous support and sustainability.

1. Scheme for Her Empowerment in Engineering Education (SHE) was initiated at the Government College of Engineering (GCE) Kannur. SHE programme aims to enable female students to realize their potential and to provide the support they require to become great leaders in technical fields. All the activities of SHE align with the vision ‘To create professionally successful and personally fulfilled Women Engineers’, catering to girls aspiring to be engineers, girl students undergoing engineering courses, and women engineers. In 2025-26, the department aims to extend the scheme to all higher education institutions under DTE. Accordingly, funds are allocated for various programmes under the SHE initiative.
2. Nurses from Kerala were much recognised and appreciated globally during the pandemic. Major interventions are proposed to improve the facilities and to modernise various nursing schools which include strengthening of labs, procurement of materials, capacity building for faculty, maintenance, and renovation of buildings.
3. Kudumbasree Mission remains the most successful scheme in the reduction of poverty in the state, mobilizing women and ensuring their livelihood. Kudumbasree spearheads community-based intervention of poor women with a focus on self-help, demand-led convergence of available services and resources under the leadership of the local governments.
4. Co-operation, agriculture, animal husbandry, and dairy development are major sectors to create employment opportunities for women and enhance food security in the State.
5. Cooperative Initiative in Technology-driven Agriculture (CITA) co-operative initiative in technology-driven agriculture by the Department of Co-operation, Government of Kerala, will support directly and indirectly women-oriented groups

and organisations through financial assistance to Primary Agricultural Credit Society (PACS) for the promotion of Self-Help Groups (SHGs), incentives to the SHGs promoted by PACS, SC / ST Co-operatives, and women co-operatives, direct and indirect employment generation to women and women-oriented groups and organisations.

6. Farm plan-based production programme – to increase the productivity of individual farms through multiple cropping and farming systems have a strong women component of 50% that directly benefit women is continuing. It is envisaged that 50 percent of the beneficiaries of the scheme will be women.
7. Schemes, with percentage of share, for rice development (33 percent), vegetable development (33 percent), development of fruits, flowers, and medicinal plants (25 percent), organic farming (10 percent), and support for farm mechanisation (15 percent), have ensured women component in the agriculture sector. Allocations for rice development and vegetable development have increased considerably.
8. Animal Husbandry department is implementing a scheme Kudumbasree Linked Forage Programme and Establishment of Fodder Demonstration Units
9. Backyard poultry development project through rural women (KEPCO-Ashraya) is the scheme under Kerala State Poultry Development Corporation which provides a subsidiary income to widows and destitute through backyard poultry production and support for attaining self-sufficiency in the production and consumption of egg and meat in the State.
10. The dairy development schemes of commercial dairy and milk shed development the programme, cattle feed subsidy, production and conservation of fodder in farmers' fields and dairy co-operatives percent allocation for women beneficiaries decreased this year.
11. In fisheries, a major subcomponent of the continuing scheme, namely, basic infrastructural facilities and human development of fisherfolk, is providing alternate or supportive livelihood activities for fisherwomen which include providing support to the fisherwomen groups for alternate livelihood activities and ensuring the sustainability of already assisted fisherwomen groups. It includes the provision for providing working capital assistance to fisherwomen by forming JLG based on fish landing centres and marketing centres. The Department of Fisheries with the support of the Society for Assistance to Fisherwomen (SAF) ensures the implementation of the scheme.

12. It has tried to augment the entrepreneurial competency among fisherwomen by encouraging microenterprises by utilising local resources. SAF has formed small activity-based groups of fisherwomen and extended financial, technological, and managerial support to set up small enterprises suitable for the local area.
13. Samudra is a component of the scheme "Modernisation of Fish Markets, Value Addition, Post-Harvest Activities". An exclusive transportation facility for women fish vendors initiated by the Fisheries Department and Kerala State Road Transport Corporation in Thiruvananthapuram district is a great endeavour in supporting them and empowering them by providing them with free logistic support.
14. The Forest Department ensured women component of 10, 10, and 30 percent for their three major schemes - Forest Protection, Infrastructure Development, and Measures to reduce Human-Animal Conflict – respectively.
15. *Silk Samagra* scheme (CSS) is to scale up production of silk, improving the quality and productivity, and also to empower socially and economically backward families through various activities of sericulture in the country. It is continuing with 50 percent earmarked for women.
16. The industries department has a scheme, *Local Economic Development and Sustainability of Enterprises* with a 10 percent component exclusively for women. The scheme envisages the sustainability of enterprises and local economic development through the integration of various activities of departments and agencies.
17. In industries, a scheme, named *Special Package Scheme for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs)*, envisages providing formal assistance to functional MSMEs (in their running stage) and providing support for scaling up of existing enterprises from micro to small enterprises and small to medium enterprises. This scheme is beneficial to women entrepreneurs. Women Entrepreneurship Mission by KSIDC has a substantial allocation for giving financial assistance to women entrepreneurs in Kerala.
18. The International Centre for Free and Open-Source Software (ICFOSS) provides support through gender and technology hackathons, back to work, women's winter school and summer school, virtual training, campaigns and fellowships in their gender technology initiative component.
19. Kerala Start Up Mission has been fostering & promoting women entrepreneurs in the technology domain by providing technical, financial, business connect, and

intervening policies for the enterprise to start, scale, and accelerate in Kerala and successfully implementing the Youth Entrepreneurship Development Programme with Women Startup Pipeline. It Supports 500 women innovators to start up and manage their ventures.

20. Kerala University of Digital Sciences scheme - Innovation and Technology - Women Incubation, Startups and Entrepreneurship (WISE) to empower women through entrepreneurship.
21. Back to Lab research program – Back to Lab is a program envisaged to providing research fellowships leading to PhD and post-doctoral fellowships in science to qualified women of Kerala who have gone career break and wish to return to mainstream research.
22. Students with Talent and Aptitude for Research in Science (STARS) - The objective of the STARS programme is to encourage talented girl students to pursue higher education in Basic or Applied Sciences through the Prathibha Scholarship scheme and Student Programme for Excellence in Experimental Design (SPEED) programme.
23. SC & ST Unemployed Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (SC&ST-UWISTEM) – The programme aims at identifying unemployed SC and ST women scientists in the State and support them for science and technology intervention for social benefits in the specific areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.
24. Responsible Tourism Mission started the Women Friendly Tourism Initiative in the state. RT Mission started an initiative to convert Kerala into a 100% Women Friendly Destination. This project focuses on making a network of 1,50,000 women community members which will ensure 30,000 new job opportunities for women through 10,000 women enterprises in the tourism sector. 78 destination's safety assessment was completed as part of this project. Various Training programmes for women community members were also completed as part of this project. UN WOMEN also part of this initiative and the Global Women Conference on Gender Inclusive Tourism was held in Munnar, Kerala from 30th November to 2nd December 2024.
25. Kerala State Chalachitra Academy started a non-traditional employment training programme through an innovative new scheme — *Employment training for women*

in the technical field of cinema, to provide employment training in technical sides of cinema for women.

26. Kerala Lalitha Kala Academy and Kerala Sahithya Academy are organising workshops and camps for artists and writers from women and transgender community to support them for the development in film and television media and for the promotion and development of Malayalam language and literature.
27. Renaissance Scholarship – *Special Scholarship for girls who have lost a parent or both* by providing financial assistance for education from other backward classes will be continued
28. NORKA introduced a scheme named *Subhayathra* in the year 2023-24, to help young aspirants to fulfil their overseas employment dreams. (1) Foreign Employability Skilling Assistance (2) soft loans to potential emigrants to meet preparatory expenses related to employment migration. This is 50 percent earmarked for women and highly beneficial for women, especially for educated aspirants.
29. The Ayyankali Urban Employment Guarantee Scheme is intended to address the unemployment and under-employment problems in urban society. Objective of the scheme is to enhance livelihood security in urban areas by providing at least 100 days of wage employment to every household whose adult members are willing to do unskilled manual labour. 50 percent of the beneficiaries are women.

C. Social Security and Health

Social Security and health are considered the strong foundations for the better status of women in Kerala. Access to gender-responsive social protection has a positive impact on women's and girls' empowerment and opportunities.

1. Social Protection for Unorganised Sector Workers- Maternity Allowances to workers in unorganised sectors have been provided through various Welfare Boards.
2. A scheme for ensuring the social security of the elderly people in the state, *Prasanthi Senior Citizens Help Desk, and Victim Support Cell* will be introduced by Police with a significant gender component.
3. *For giving insurance coverage to all Anganwadi workers and helpers, the Ministry of Women & Child Development has initiated insurance schemes such as Pradhan Manthri Jeevan Jyothi Bheema Yojana and Pradhan Manthri Suraksha Bhima Yojana*

to cover all Anganwadi workers and helpers and the funds are allocated for this purpose.

4. A new Self-employment Scheme is introduced to provide financial assistance for self-employment to widows belonging to OBCs. Any venture that can be carried out profitably can be sanctioned based on its feasibility. A similar scheme is introduced to provide financial assistance for self-employment to widows, divorcees, and abandoned women belonging to minorities.
5. New components were added to provide capital subsidies to entrepreneurship programmes in dairy farming as well as to purchase electric autos for women of economically weaker sections among Forward Communities.
6. All Transgender People and People with Disabilities are included under the health insurance scheme Karunya Arogya Surksha Padhathi (KASP).
7. A significant increase in allocation is made in Augmentation of facilities for early detection / treatment of women-oriented cancer (Regional Cancer Centres). This is to enhance the facilities for early detection and prompt treatment with high precision and less side effects of women oriented cancers.
8. Breast cancer and cervical cancer are the most common forms of cancer among women accounting for more deaths than any other cancer. Cancer screening tests are an important tool to combat this cancer-related morbidity and mortality. A state-wide screening campaign will be conducted by the Health Services Department to address the issue as part of the NCD control programme and in association with Cancer Centres
9. All major schemes in the health sector are continuing with enhanced allocation. All systems of medicine – modern medicine, ayurveda, and homeopathy have women-specific schemes in which funds are ensured for infrastructure development, faculty improvement, treatment facilities, and nutritional support.
10. In Ayurveda, financial support for the gynaecology and management of children with disabilities has been increased four times to expand its reach and coverage.
11. Mental health programmes have been given importance to address women's mental health issues, treatment, counselling, rehabilitation, and community interventions. District mental health programme has a special programme, *Amma Manasu*, for addressing issues related to post-partum depression among new mothers.
12. Under Health Services, Palliative care services are provided at three levels viz, (1) Primary level - home-based care supported by LSGI and PHC (2) Secondary level -

specialty palliative care - hospital-based, supported by civil society initiatives and Taluk level hospital and (3) Tertiary level-advanced care supported by civil society initiatives and medical colleges. These Palliative care centres give care to patients living with chronic illness by offering physical, social, and psychological needs of patients and their families. Funds provided for supporting primary, secondary & state level palliative care institutions, strengthening of secondary level palliative care, establishing of Palliative Care Grid, and for providing other incentives for palliative care and establishment of geriatric care centres during 2025-26. The activities proposed are; elderly friendly hospital initiative, training on elderly care, elderly care day celebrations, and IEC. It is expected that about 50 percent of the fund will be utilized for the benefit of women.

13. The state has a significant number of social security schemes and social welfare institutions for providing care, protection, and rehabilitation. Women constitute the majority of this sector either directly or as caregivers for persons in vulnerable conditions.
14. SARANYA is a Self-Employment Scheme for Registered Unemployed Widows / Deserted / Divorced / Unmarried Women / Unwedded Mothers, Women with Disabilities, Wives of Bedridden Persons
15. Providing a Protein rich Noon meal for all trainees of women is a unique social security programme for ensuring the health and stamina of young women technicians.
16. *The Aswasakiranam* scheme provides assistance to caregivers, largely women of physically and intellectually challenged persons, and the *Snehasparsham* scheme includes rehabilitation of unwed mothers and their children. These two schemes are directly benefitting women.
17. Three major schemes in social security and welfare, namely, the National Institute of Speech and Hearing (NISH), *Vayomithram*, and *Anuyathra* support people with speech and hearing disabilities, the aged and for early intervention and management of disabilities respectively. A large number of women are beneficiaries of these programs who contribute as caregivers, technicians, therapists, and managers. The allocation has been increased in all these programs in the Gender Budget 2025-26.
18. Continuing schemes of unorganised workers' social security scheme, health insurance for interstate migrant workers (AWAS), *Vimukthi* – de-addiction Programme, comprehensive package for the victims of Endosulfan, Karunya Arogya Suraksha Padhathi (KASP), cancer care programmes, pain, palliative and elderly health care,

health and education support programmes for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) communities, various marriage assistance schemes and financial support for maternity are also providing support to women in Gender Budget 2025-26.

D. Gender-friendly infrastructure

Women and transgender persons face numerous barriers when trying to access basic services, such as education, health, economic opportunities, and social participation. Poor infrastructure can worsen the situation, limiting access to resources; constraining them to gain opportunities, and limiting access to public spaces. Gender concerns in infrastructure have been gaining focus much slower than other gender needs in our society. Earlier Gender Budget initiatives had impacts on the infrastructure sector. All the existing infrastructure projects for women are continuing. Major schemes are related to housing, under LIFE Mission, Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana (PMAY), and housing schemes for SC / ST / OBC communities addressing their economic deprivation and landlessness. Some of the earlier infrastructure projects are completed and some others are nearing completion.

1. PG Hostel for Women is an important scheme in housing for providing better, safe and secure accommodation facilities to working women / those pursuing higher studies at affordable rates.
2. Rental Housing Scheme for Government Employees in KSHB owned Land is a scheme by Kerala State Housing Board. This scheme is intended for constructing residential flats as quarters which are to be allotted to Government employees on rental basis in the land owned by the Board in Wayanad and Kozhikode. 40 percent of the scheme is earmarked for women.
3. The programme named ‘Thaneyidam’ (My own space) by Kerala State Housing Board aims at providing houses to the homeless children living in government/non-government welfare institutions who have to leave these institutions once they attain 18 years of age. Kerala State Housing Board would implement the scheme in collaboration with the Department of Women and Child Development. The already constructed / being constructed houses of Housing Board shall be allotted to Thaneyidam beneficiaries. Priority will be given to survivors of POCSO. 50 percent of the houses under Thaneyidam project should be given only to women.
4. The Loan linked subsidy scheme is a scheme that the Housing Board intends to implement to realize the dream of owning a house for those belonging to LIG /

MIG1 category who own at least 3 cents of land and have taken housing loan assistance from any nationalized bank. While implementing the scheme, transgender persons may also be considered if the need comes through Social Justice Department.

5. Sakhi Nivas (State share scheme for CSS), aims to ensure availability of safe and comfortable accommodation for women who have to live away from their families due to professional commitments, working women and other women pursuing higher education or training. This is actually a revamped scheme of Working Women's hostels.
6. Modernisation of subordinate courts scheme has a women component added to the scheme which includes renovation and construction of public washroom with special facilities for women, children and differently abled persons and for providing other infrastructural facilities.
7. *Nirbhaya* programmes – construction of women and children homes, *Nirbhaya* shelter homes, and One Stop Centres are continuing schemes.
8. Studio Apartment for working women in urban area is an important initiative by Labour Commissionerate for providing good quality, decent and safe accommodation for working women across Kerala. This scheme is continuing in Gender Budget 2025-26.
9. *Ente Koodu* scheme by WCD aims at providing overnight, free shelter to women and children who reach the cities.
10. Vanitha Mithra Kendra (Working Women's Hostel)- KSWDC is presently operating **11 Working Women's Hostels** in Gandhinagar, Kakkanad, Mananthawady, Perinthalmanna, Manjeri, Kannur, Thiruvananthapuram, Tirur, Kozhikode, Pathanamthitta, and Palakkad. The Safe Stay programme of the KSWDC aims at available safe and affordable accommodation for women in hostels and economy hotels across the State. A comprehensive app has been developed- "**Safe Stay**" for public access for checking room availability and comparing room tariffs, facilities, and reservations. This programme is helpful for women who are travelling alone for both personal and professional purposes.
11. Under the Gender Budgeting scheme of the Public Works Department, a women-specific scheme for providing the basic amenities and additional facilities for women in public places and offices is continuing in Gender Budget 2025-26.
